




The Wrath of Men Matthew 27:35–44; Mark 15:24–32; Luke 23:33–43; John 19:18–27

## John 19:1, "Then Pilate therefore took Jesus, and scourged Him."





John 19:2, "And the soldiers wove a crown of thorns and put it on His head, and arrayed Him in a purple robe;"



John 19:6, "Therefore, when the chief priests and officers saw Him, they cried out, saying, 'Crucify Him, crucify Him!' Pilate said to them, 'You take Him and crucify Him, for I find no fault in Him.'"

John 19:7, "We have a law, and by that law He ought to die, because He made Himself the Son of God."

John 19:15, "But they cried out, 'Away with Him, away with Him! Crucify Him!' Pilate said to them, 'Shall I crucify your King?' The chief priests answered, 'We have no king but Caesar!'

John 19:16, "Then he delivered Him to them to be crucified. Then they took Jesus and led Him away."

#### 1. Stages 1-5: The Procession to Golgotha





Stage 1. They lead Jesus out to crucify Him.


Matt. 27:31, "And when they had mocked Him, they took the robe off Him, put His own clothes on Him, and led Him away to be crucified."

Mark 15:20, "And when they had mocked Him, they took the purple off Him, put His own clothes on Him, and led Him out to crucify Him."

John 19:16, "Then he delivered Him to them to be crucified. Then they took Jesus and led Him away."







Stage 2. They grab Simon of Cyrene, and conscript him to carry His cross. Mark 15:21; Matt. 27:32; Luke 23:26

Luke 23:26, "Now as they led Him away, they laid hold of a certain man, Simon a Cyrenian, who was coming from the country, and on him they laid the cross that he might bear it after Jesus."


Stage 3. <u>Jesus tells the women mourning</u> not to weep for Him but for themselves and their children.


Luke 23:27, "And a great multitude of the people followed Him, and women who also mourned and lamented Him."

Stage 4. The arrival at Golgotha, the place of the skull. Matt. 27:33; Mark 15:22; Luke 23:33 "Calvary"; John 19:17

Matt. 27:33, "And when they had come to a place called Golgotha, that is to say, Place of a Skull,"

Luke 23:33, "And when they had come to the place called Calvary,"





Stage 5. They give Jesus wine with gall to drink, but He did not drink. Matt. 27:34; Mark 15:23

Matt. 27:34, "they gave Him sour wine mingled with gall to drink. But when He had tasted it, He would not drink."

Mark 15:23, "Then they gave Him wine mingled with myrrh to drink, but He did not take it."




Mark 15:25, "Now it was the third hour [9 AM], and they crucified Him."

#### Four Stages of Crucifixion











This is how the feet of Jesus were nailed to the cross.

#### Four Stages of Crucifixion

- 1. The criminal carried the patibulum (crossbeam) to the execution site.
- 2. The criminal would be tied or nailed to the patibulum.
- 3. The beam would then be raised by forked poles to the top of the *stipis*, the vertical post.
- 4. A tablet specifying the crime would be nailed to the top of the cross or hung around the neck.

Psa. 22:14, "I am poured out like water, and all My bones are out of joint; My heart is like wax; It has melted within Me.

Psa. 22:15, "My strength is dried up like a potsherd, and My tongue clings to My jaws; You have brought Me to the dust of death.

Psa. 22:16, "For dogs have surrounded Me; The congregation of the wicked has enclosed Me. They pierced My hands and My feet;

Psa. 22:17, "I can count all My bones. They look and stare at Me."

Stage 7. They crucified Jesus with two others, one on each side with Jesus in the middle. Luke 23:33; Matt. 27:38; Mark 15:27–28

Matt. 27:38, "Then two robbers were crucified with Him, one on the right and another on the left."

John 19:18, "where they crucified Him, and two others with Him, one on either side, and Jesus in the center"

ληστής *lēstēs* nom masc plur "robber, bandit; insurrectionist" (Matt., Mark)

κακοῦργος kakourgos acc masc plur "evil, evil-doer, criminal" (Luke)

Isa. 53:12, "Therefore I will divide Him a portion with the great, and He shall divide the spoil with the strong, because He poured out His soul unto death, and He was numbered with the transgressors, and He bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors."

Stage 9. They put a sign over Him, the indictment for His crime.

Matt. 27:37, "And they put up over His head the <u>accusation</u> written against Him: THIS IS JESUS THE KING OF THE JEWS."


John 19:19, "Now Pilate wrote a title and put it on the cross. And the writing was: JESUS OF NAZARETH, THE KING OF THE JEWS.

John 19:20, "Then many of the Jews read this title, for the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city; and it was written in Hebrew, Greek, and Latin.

John 19:21, "Therefore the chief priests of the Jews said to Pilate, 'Do not write, "The King of the Jews," but, "He said, 'I am the King of the Jews.'"

John 19:22, "Pilate answered, 'What I have written, I have written.'"

Mark 15:24: Luke 23:34: John 19:23–24

Matt. 27:35, "Then they crucified Him, and divided His garments, casting lots, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet: 'They divided My garments among them, and for My clothing they cast lots.'" [Ps. 22:18]

John 19:23, "Then the soldiers, when they had crucified Jesus, took His garments and made four parts, to each soldier a part, and also the tunic. Now the tunic was without seam, woven from the top in one piece.

John 19:24, "They said therefore among themselves, 'Let us not tear it, but cast lots for it, whose it shall be,' that the Scripture might be fulfilled which says: 'They divided My garments among them, and for My clothing they cast lots.' Therefore the soldiers did these things."
