1 Pet. 1:6, "In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while, if need be, you have been grieved by various trials,

1 Pet. 1:7, "that the genuineness of your faith, being much more precious than gold that perishes, though it is tested by fire, may be found to praise, honor, and glory at the revelation of Jesus Christ,

1 Pet. 1:8, "whom having not seen you love. Though now you do not see Him, yet believing, you rejoice with joy inexpressible and full of glory,

1 Pet. 1:9, "receiving the end of your faith the salvation of your souls."

Phil. 2:30, "because for the work of Christ he came close to death, not regarding his <u>life</u>, to supply what was lacking in your service toward me."



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#### Focal point of vss. 9–10

Of this deliverance from temporal <u>testing</u> which brought <u>GLORY</u> to God the prophets have inquired and searched carefully ... the Spirit of Christ ... testified beforehand the <u>sufferings</u> of Christ and the <u>GLORIES</u> that would follow. 1 Pet. 1:10, "Of this salvation [deliverance from and through the testing] the prophets have inquired and searched carefully, who prophesied of the grace that would come to you,"

έξεραυνάω exeraunaō aor act indic 3 plur to search diligently in the sense of investigation, inquiry; used of the tracking by animals to sniff out something

1 Pet. 1:10, "Of this salvation [deliverance from and through the testing] <u>the prophets</u> have inquired and searched carefully, <u>who</u> <u>prophesied</u> of the grace that would come to you,"

προφήτης prophētēs nom masc plur prophet no article, could simply be "prophets" rather than "the prophets" but a reference to Old Testament prophets is understood προφητεύω prophēteuō aor act part masc plur nom to prophesy 1 Pet. 1:10, "Of this salvation [deliverance from and through the testing] <u>the prophets</u> have inquired and searched carefully, who prophesied of the <u>grace that would come to</u> <u>you</u>," 1 Pet. 1:10, "Of this salvation [deliverance from and through the testing] <u>the prophets</u> have inquired and searched carefully, who prophesied of the grace to you,"

What is this "grace"?

- a. <u>Common grace</u>: God's grace to the saved and unsaved alike?
- b. <u>Saving grace</u>: the grace of imputation, justification, regeneration at the point of faith alone in Christ alone.
- <u>Spiritual life grace</u>: (sanctifying grace) grace for growth (2 Pet. 3:18).
- d. Dying grace: grace at physical death.

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ἐραυνάω *eraunaō* pres act part masc plur nom probably a participle of means to search, examine *by examining* or *by searching out what*  1 Pet. 1:11, "searching <u>what</u>, or <u>what manner</u> of time, the Spirit of Christ who was in them was indicating when He testified beforehand the sufferings of Christ and the glories that would follow."

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Rom. 8:9, "But you are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if indeed <u>the Spirit of God dwells in</u> you. Now if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he is not His." 1 Pet. 1:11, "searching what, or what manner of time, the Spirit of Christ who was in them <u>was indicating</u> when He testified beforehand the sufferings of Christ and the glories that would follow."

πάθημα pathēma acc neut plur suffering the sufferings which were directed toward Christ

δόξα *doxa* acc fem plur opinion; glory cf, 1:7 and 1:8 2 Tim. 3:16, "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness,

2 Tim. 3:17, "that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for <u>every</u> good work."

θεόπνευστος theopneustos nom fem sing (verbal) God-breathed Matt. 5:18, "For assuredly, I say to you, till heaven and earth pass away, one jot or one <u>tittle</u> will by no means pass from the law till all is fulfilled."

Gal. 3:16, "Now to Abraham and his Seed were the promises made. He does not say, 'And to <u>seeds</u>,' <u>as of many, but as of one,</u> 'And to your <u>Seed</u>,' who is Christ." 2 Pet. 1:19, "And so we have the prophetic word confirmed, which you do well to heed as a light that shines in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts;

2 Pet. 1:20, "knowing this first, that no prophecy of Scripture is of any private interpretation,

2 Pet. 1:21, "for prophecy never came by the will of man, but holy men of God spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit."

## inspiration [Greek,

geovpneusto" (theopneustos) literally "Godbreathed"] God the Holy Spirit so supernaturally directed the human writers of Scripture, that without waiving their human intelligence, vocabulary, individuality, literary style, personality, personal feelings, or any other human factor, His complete and coherent message to mankind was recorded with perfect accuracy in the original languages of Scripture, the very words bearing the authority of divine authorship. (John 10:35; Matthew 5:18; 2 Timothy 3:16; 2 Peter 1:21; 1 Corinthians 2:14-16)
