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חְרְמְה hokmāh: "Wisdom, skill, experience, shrewdness" Wisdom is skillfully applied doctrine.

Job 28:28, "And to man He said, 'Behold, the fear of the Lord, that is wisdom, and to depart from evil is understanding'."

Prov 1:7, "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and instruction."

Prov 8:13, "The fear of the LORD is to hate evil; Pride and arrogance and the evil way and the perverse mouth I hate."

Prov 1:26, "I also will laugh at your calamity; I will mock when your terror comes,

Prov 1:27, "When your terror comes like a storm, and your destruction comes like a whirlwind, when distress and anguish come upon you.

Prov 1:28, "Then they will call on me, but I will not answer; they will seek me diligently, but they will not find me.

Prov 1:29, "Because they hated knowledge and did not choose the fear of the LORD,

Prov 1:30, "They would have none of my counsel and despised my every rebuke.

Prov 1:31, "Therefore they shall eat the fruit of their own way, and be filled to the full with their own fancies.

Prov 1:32, "For the turning away of the simple will slay them, and the complacency of fools will destroy them;

Prov 1:33, "But whoever listens to me will dwell safely, and will be secure, without fear of evil."

Psa 23:1, "A Psalm of David. The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want."

Psa 23:4, "Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; for You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me."

Phil 1:21, "For to me, to live is Christ, and to die is gain."

2 Cor 5:1, "For we know that if our earthly house, this tent, is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.
