

μνημόνευε mnemoneue, present active imperative: ongoing practice Remember, look back at what you used to do

λαμβάνω *lambánō*; Perfect act ind, "to receive," indicates how they received or learned the Word.

The perfect tense suggests the present reality from a past action.



ἀκούω akoúō; Aorist Act ind of akouo

"to hear with a view to application"

τηρέω tēréō

guard, preserve; hold fast to, keep, follow, keep your eyes fixed on it. Focus on it.

Make it your priority.

μετανοέω *metanoéō*; to change your mind, thinking.
