1. Man was created as God's vicegerent to rule the planet for God.

2. When Adam disobeyed God in the garden and followed Satan, the title of King of the Earth was lost and usurped by Satan who became the illegitimate ruler of the planet.

3. Satan's defeat is secured at the cross; but his final destruction awaits the return of the King.


4. Jesus Christ, as God-man, not only pays the penalty for our sin, but He also redeems the planet to restore the Kingdom to man. As the Son of Man and as the Son of David Jesus Christ fulfills these covenants and takes His throne to rule the Kingdom.

Dan 7:13, "I was watching in the night visions, and behold, One like the Son of Man, coming with the clouds of heaven! He came to the Ancient of Days, and they brought Him near before Him.

Dan 7:14, "Then to Him was given dominion and glory and a kingdom, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve Him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and His kingdom the one which shall not be destroyed."


2 Sam 7:16, "And your house and your kingdom shall be established forever before you. Your throne shall be established forever."

5. The scenes in ch. 5 show us final enactment as the Rightful Ruler, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, prepares to destroy the usurper Satan, judge the rebels (demons and humans), and to take rightful ownership of His realm.



Rev 4:6, "Before the throne there was a sea of glass, like crystal. And in the midst of the throne, and around the throne, were four living creatures full of eyes in front and in back.

Rev 4:7, "The first living creature was like a lion, the second living creature like a calf, the third living creature had a face like a man, and the fourth living creature was like a flying eagle.



Rev 5:6, "And I looked, and behold, in the midst of the throne and of the four living creatures, and in the midst of the elders, stood a Lamb as though it had been slain, having seven horns and seven eyes, which are the seven Spirits of God sent out into all the earth."
