

I. God sends another strong angel who announces the final doom of Babylon; 18:1–3

Rev. 18:3, "For all the nations have drunk of the wine of the wrath of her fornication, the kings of the earth have committed fornication with her, and the merchants of the earth have become rich through the power [dunameos] of her luxury."

Rev. 18:4, "And I heard another voice from heaven saying, 'Come out of her, my people, lest you share in her sins, and lest you receive of her plagues.'

Jer. 50:8, "Move from the midst of Babylon, go out of the land of the Chaldeans; and be like the rams before the flocks."

Jer. 51:6, "Flee from the midst of Babylon, and every one save his life! Do not be cut off in her iniquity, for this is the time of the LORD'S vengeance; He shall recompense her. Jer. 51:7, "Babylon was a golden cup in the LORD'S hand, that made all the earth drunk. The nations drank her wine; therefore the nations are deranged."

Jer. 51:8, "Babylon has suddenly fallen and been destroyed. Wail for her! Take balm for her pain; perhaps she may be healed. Jer. 51:9, "We would have healed Babylon, but she is not healed. Forsake her, and let us go everyone to his own country; for her judgment reaches to heaven and is lifted up to the skies."

Golden Rule of Interpretation

When the plain sense of Scripture makes common sense, seek no other sense; therefore, take every word at its primary, ordinary, usual, literal meaning unless the facts of the immediate context indicate clearly otherwise.

Rev. 18:5, "For her sins have reached to heaven, and God has remembered her iniquities."

Anthropopathism

Language of accommodation that ascribes to God human passions, emotions, thoughts, and attitudes which He does not actually possess to reveal and explain Himself, divine policy, acts, and decisions to the finite mind of man. Examples include: Grief (Gen. 6:6), remember (Gen. 8:1; 19:29), repentance (Ex. 32:14 KJV), vengeance (Isa. 1:24), hatred (Ps. 5:5), anger (Deut. 29:23), jealousy (Ex. 34:14).

Rev. 16:19, "Now the great city was divided into three parts, and the cities of the nations fell. And great Babylon was remembered before God, to give her the cup of the wine of the fierceness of His wrath."

Rev. 18:6, "Render to her just as she rendered to you, and repay her double according to her works; in the cup which she has mixed, mix double for her."

Rev. 17:16, "And the ten horns which you saw on the beast, these will hate the harlot, make her desolate and naked, eat her flesh and burn her with fire.

Rev. 17:17, "For God has put it into their hearts to fulfill His purpose, to be of one mind, and to give their kingdom to the beast, until the words of God are fulfilled."

αποδίδωμι (apodidomi),

Aor Act Imp 2 PI;

aor imperative calls for quick action; "give away, give up, give back, sell, give back what is due, recompense"

Rev. 18:7, "In the measure that she glorified herself and lived luxuriously, in the same measure give her torment and sorrow; for she says in her heart, 'I sit as queen, and am no widow, and will not see sorrow.'

Rev. 18:8, "Therefore her plagues will come in one day—death and mourning and famine. And she will be utterly burned with fire, for strong is the Lord God who judges her."

Rev. 18:9, "The kings of the earth who committed fornication and lived luxuriously with her will weep and lament for her, when they see the smoke of her burning,"

Rev. 18:10, "standing at a distance for fear of her torment, saying, 'Alas, alas, that great city Babylon, that mighty city! For in one hour your judgment has come.'

Rev. 18:11, "And the merchants of the earth will weep and mourn over her, for no one buys their merchandise anymore:"
