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κατανοέω (*katanoēō*), Pres act subj, 1P; hortatory subj; we must consider, or we should consider; “give careful thought to something, contemplate, brainstorm”

παροξυσμός (*paroxysmos*), 2× in New Testament; “to rouse to activity, to provoke action, sharp disagreement, ardent incitement; to stir to action”

Pres Act Ptcp, adverbial, modifies the command “to think”

With the negative he explains how NOT to fulfill the command.

The Doctrine of
"One Another"

1. The Greek word is ἀλλήλων; *allēlōn*, meaning one person to others in a group.

Most of the New Testament contexts are addressed to congregations.

The idea is how believers within the congregations should treat other believers in that congregation.

By extension this applies from one believer to another.

2. Love one another is the most common command. 15×

John, Paul, Peter each mention this.

In fact the other 18 “one another’s” are all manifestations of this one command: humility, forgiveness, kindness, putting up with each other, not judging or maligning or gossiping about one another.

John 13:34, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another.!"

John 13:35, "By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another."

John 15:12, "This is My commandment, that you love
one another as I have loved you.!"

John 15:17, "These things I command you, that you love
one another.!"

Rom. 13:8, "Owe! no one anything except to love one another, for he who loves another has fulfilled the law."

Gal. 5:13, "For you, brethren, have been called to liberty;
only do not use liberty as an opportunity for the flesh,
but through love serve! one another."

1 Th. 3:12, "And may the Lord make you increase and abound in love to one another and to all, just as we do to you," (imperatival infinitives)

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2 Th. 1:3, "We are bound to thank God always for you, brethren, as it is fitting, because your faith grows exceedingly, and the love of every one of you all abounds toward each other,"

1 Pet. 1:22, "Since you have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit in sincere love of the brethren, love! one another fervently with a pure heart,"

1 John 3:11, "For this is the message that you heard from the beginning, that we should love one another,!"

1 John 3:23, "And this is His commandment: that we should believe on the name of His Son Jesus Christ and love one another, as He gave us commandment."

1 John 4:7, "Beloved, let us love one another!, for love is of God; and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God."

1 John 4:11, "Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought
to love one another." (Imper Inf)

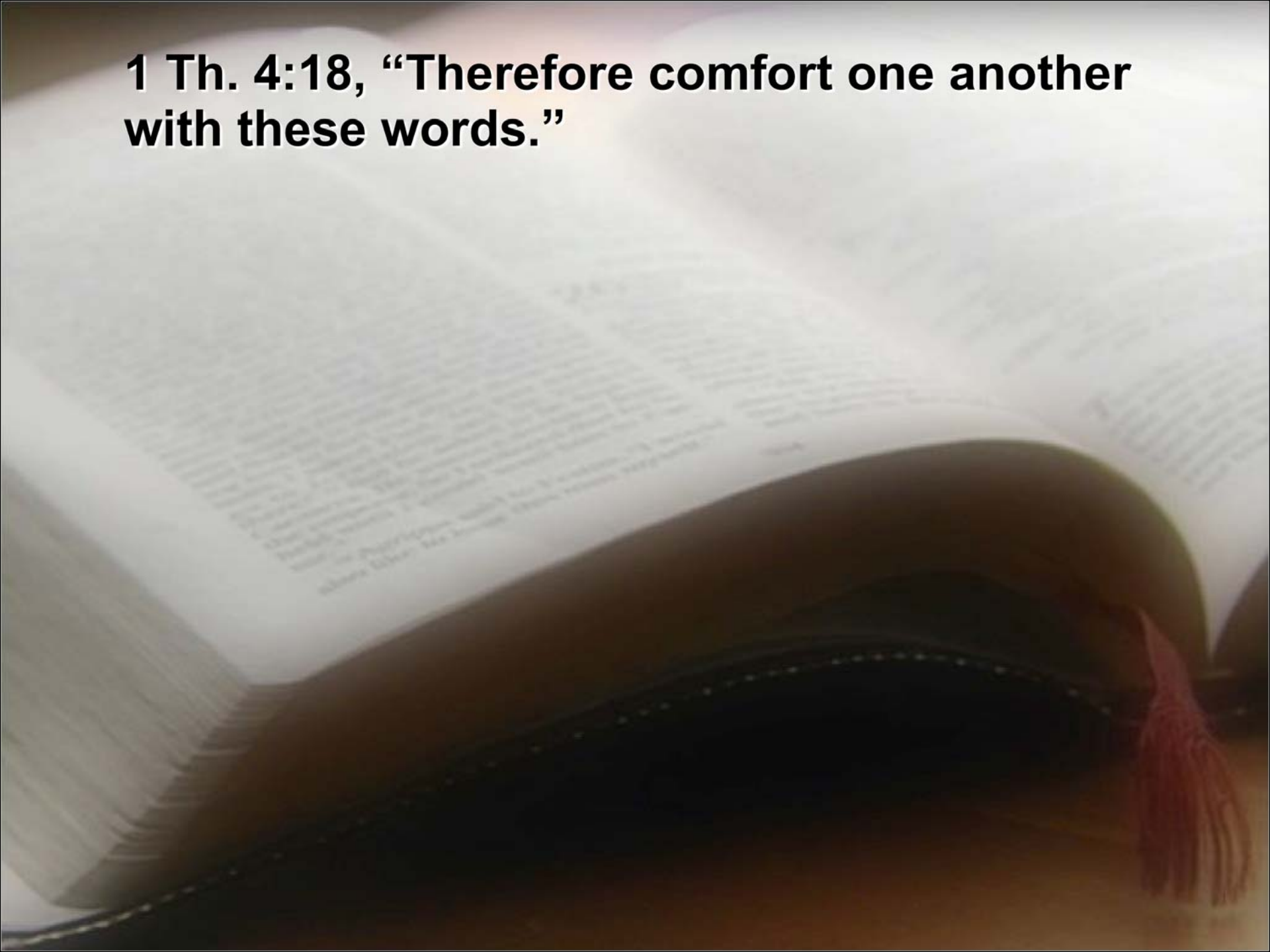
1 John 4:12, "No one has seen God at any time. If we love one another, God abides in us, and His love has been perfected in us."

2 John 5, "And now I plead with you, lady, not as though I wrote a new commandment to you, but that which we have had from the beginning: that we love one another.!"

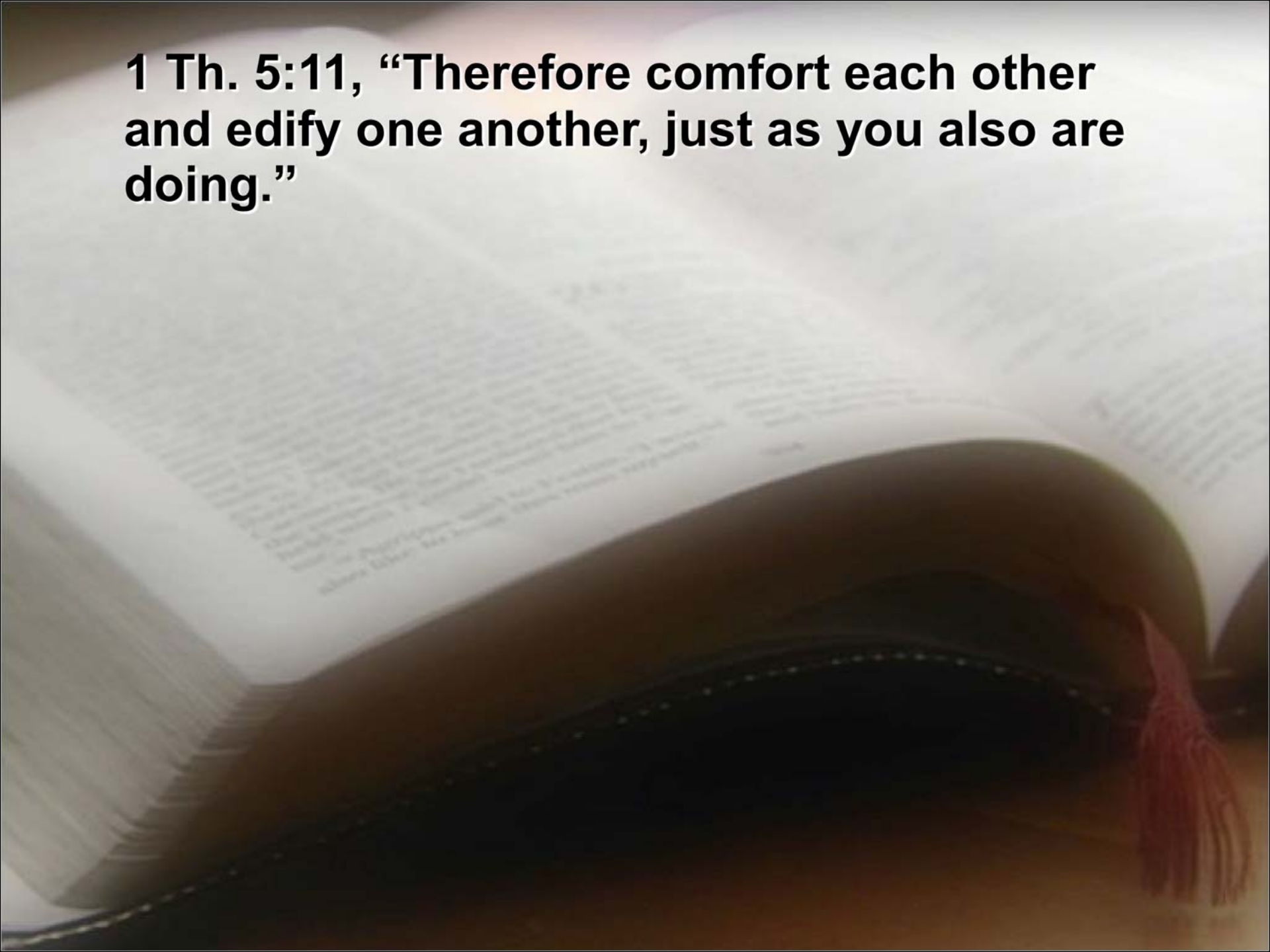
3. Encourage one another. (Rom 1:12)
