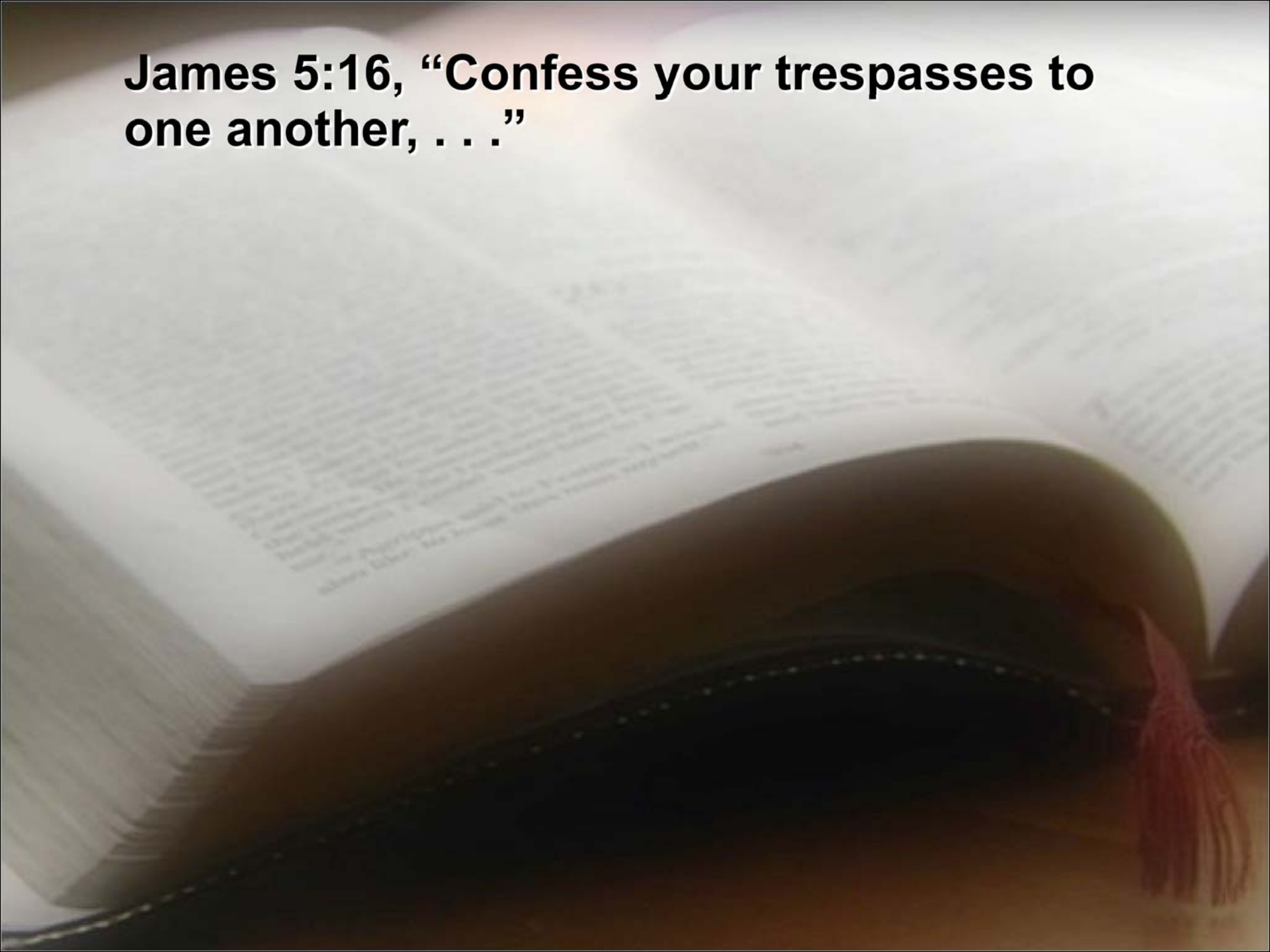




19. Pray for one another.







(Rom 14:13).**



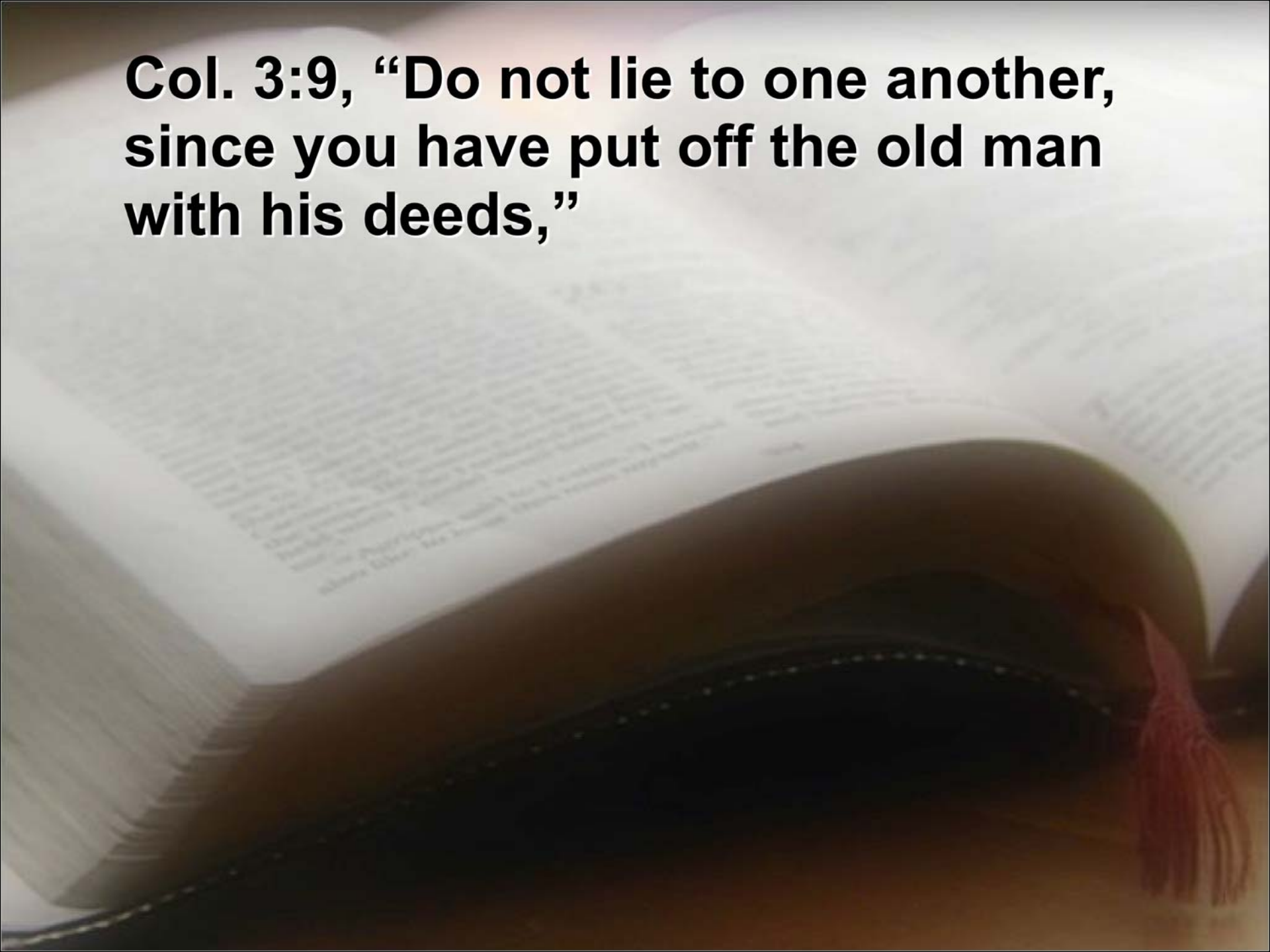


**2. Do not lie to one another
