Heb. 11:28, “By faith he kept the Passover and the sprinkling of blood, lest he who destroyed the firstborn should touch them.”

Ex. 6:1, “Then the LORD said to Moses, ‘Now you shall see what I will do to Pharaoh. For with a strong hand he will let them go, and with a strong hand he will drive them out of his land.’ ”

Ex. 6:2, “And God spoke to Moses and said to him: ‘I am the LORD.’ ”

Ex. 6:3, “I appeared to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, as God Almighty, but by My name LORD I was not known to them.

Ex. 6:4, “I have also established My covenant with them, to give them the land of Canaan, the land of their pilgrimage, in which they were strangers.”

Ex. 6:5, “And I have also heard the groaning of the children of Israel whom the Egyptians keep in bondage, and I have remembered My covenant.

Ex. 6:6, “Therefore say to the children of Israel: ‘I am the LORD; I will bring you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians, I will rescue you from their bondage, and I will redeem you with an outstretched arm and with great judgments.’ ”

Ex. 6:7, “ ‘I will take you as My people, and I will be your God. Then you shall know that I am the LORD your God who brings you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians.

Ex. 6:8, “ ‘And I will bring you into the land which I swore to give to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob; and I will give it to you as a heritage: I am the LORD.’ ”

The Ten Plagues




Ex. 7:17, “Thus says the LORD: ‘By this you shall know that I am the LORD. Behold, I will strike the waters which are in the river with the rod that is in my hand, and they shall be turned to blood.

Ex. 7:18, “ ‘And the fish that are in the river shall die, the river shall stink, and the Egyptians will loathe to drink the water of the river.’ ”

Ex. 8:5, “Then the LORD spoke to Moses, ‘Say to Aaron, “Stretch out your hand with your rod over the streams, over the rivers, and over the ponds, and cause frogs to come up on the land of Egypt.” ’

Ex. 8:6, “So Aaron stretched out his hand over the waters of Egypt, and the frogs came up and covered the land of Egypt.”



Ex. 8:16, “So the LORD said to Moses, ‘Say to Aaron, “Stretch out your rod, and strike the dust of the land, so that it may become lice throughout all the land of Egypt.” ’

Ex. 8:17, “And they did so. For Aaron stretched out his hand with his rod and struck the dust of the earth, and it became lice on man and beast. All the dust of the land became lice throughout all the land of Egypt.”



Ex. 8:20b, “Thus says the LORD: ‘Let My people go, that they may serve Me.

Ex. 8:21, “ ‘Or else, if you will not let My people go, behold, I will send swarms of flies on you and your servants, on your people and into your houses. The houses of the Egyptians shall be full of swarms of flies, and also the ground on which they stand.

Ex. 8:22, “ ‘And in that day I will set apart the land of Goshen, in which My people dwell, that no swarms of flies shall be there, in order that you may know that I am the LORD in the midst of the land.

Ex. 8:23, “ ‘I will make a difference between My people and your people. Tomorrow this sign shall be.’ ”





Ex. 9:2, “ ‘For if you refuse to let them go, and still hold them,

Ex. 9:3, “ ‘behold, the hand of the LORD will be on your cattle in the field, on the horses, on the donkeys, on the camels, on the oxen, and on the sheep—a very severe pestilence.’ ”



Ex. 9:4, “ ‘And the LORD will make a difference between the livestock of Israel and the livestock of Egypt. So nothing shall die of all that belongs to the children of Israel.’ ”

Ex. 9:5, “Then the LORD appointed a set time, saying, ‘Tomorrow the LORD will do this thing in the land.’ ”

Ex. 9:6, “So the LORD did this thing on the next day, and all the livestock of Egypt died; but of the livestock of the children of Israel, not one died.”




Ex. 9:8, “So the LORD said to Moses and Aaron, ‘Take for yourselves handfuls of ashes from a furnace, and let Moses scatter it toward the heavens in the sight of Pharaoh.

Ex. 9:9, “ ‘And it will become fine dust in all the land of Egypt, and it will cause boils that break out in sores.’ ”

Ex. 9:22, “Then the LORD said to Moses, ‘Stretch out your hand toward heaven, that there may be hail in all the land of Egypt—on man, on beast, and on every herb of the field, throughout the land of Egypt.’

Ex. 9:23, “And Moses stretched out his rod toward heaven; and the LORD sent thunder and hail, and fire darted to the ground. And the LORD rained hail on the land of Egypt.

Ex. 9:24, “So there was hail, and fire mingled with the hail, so very heavy that there was none like it in all the land of Egypt since it became a nation.”




Ex. 9:25, “And the hail struck throughout the whole land of Egypt, all that was in the field, both man and beast; and the hail struck every herb of the field and broke every tree of the field.

Ex. 9:26, “Only in the land of Goshen, where the children of Israel were, there was no hail.”





Ex. 11:7, “But against none of the children of Israel shall a dog move its tongue, against man or beast, that you may know that the LORD does make a difference between the Egyptians and Israel.”



1. Water to blood	1. Hapi/Apis, the bull god, god of the Nile, Isis goddess of the Nile, Khnum, guardian of the Nile
2. Frogs	2. Heqet, frog's head goddess of birth
3. Gnats	3. Set, god of the desert
4. Flies	4. Re, sun god; or the god Uatchit, possibly represented by the fly
5. Death of cattle	5. Hathos, cow's head goddess, Apis, the bull god, symbol of fertility
6. Boils	6. Sekmet, goddess with power over disease; Sunu, the pestilence god; Isis, goddess of healing
7. Fiery hail	7. Nut, sky goddess; Osiris, god of crops and fertility; Set, sky god
8. Grasshopper/locusts	8. Nut, sky goddess; Osiris, god of crops and fertility
9. Darkness	9. Re, sun god; Hous, sun god; Nut, sky god
10. Death of Firstborn	10. Min, god of reproduction; Heqet goddess of childbirth; Pharaoh's firstborn son was a god
