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Hebrews 12:14–15

**Pursuing Peace:
God's Resolution of Our Conflict
is the Pattern for Us to Resolve Conflicts**

Heb. 12:14, “Pursue peace with all people, and holiness, without which no one will see the Lord:”

Eph. 4:32, “And be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God in Christ forgave you.

Eph. 5:1, “Therefore be imitators of God as dear children.

Eph. 5:2, “And walk in love, as Christ also has loved us and given Himself for us, an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweet-smelling aroma.”

χρηστός (chrēstos) – “that which causes no discomfort, meets a high standard of value, in relationships: benevolent, kind, pleasant”

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Lev. 3:5, “and Aaron’s sons shall burn it on the altar upon the burnt sacrifice, which *is* on the wood that *is* on the fire, as an offering made by fire, a sweet aroma to the LORD.”

Rom. 5:10, “For if when we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life.”

Perfect passive participle: emphasis on present reality of a past completed action

2 Cor. 5:17, “Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new.

2 Cor. 5:18, “Now all things are of God, who has reconciled us to Himself through Jesus Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation,”

2 Cor. 5:19, “that is, that God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself, not imputing their trespasses to them, and has committed to us the word of reconciliation.

2 Cor. 5:20, “Now then, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were pleading through us: we implore on Christ’s behalf, be reconciled to God.”

Col. 2:13, “And you, when you were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, He has made alive together with Him, by having forgiven you all trespasses,

Col. 2:14, “because He wiped out the handwriting of requirements that was against us, which was contrary to us. And He has taken it out of the way, by having nailed it to the cross.”

Luke 17:3, “Take heed to yourselves. If your brother sins against you, rebuke him; and if he repents, forgive him.

Luke 17:4, “And if he sins against you seven times in a day, and seven times in a day returns to you, saying, ‘I repent,’ you shall forgive him.”

Luke 7:36, “Then one of the Pharisees asked Him to eat with him. And He went to the Pharisee’s house, and sat down to eat.

Luke 7:37, “And behold, a woman in the city who was a sinner, when she knew that Jesus sat at the table in the Pharisee’s house, brought an alabaster flask of fragrant oil,”

Luke 7:38, “and stood at His feet behind Him weeping; and she began to wash His feet with her tears, and wiped them with the hair of her head; and she kissed His feet and anointed them with the fragrant oil.

Luke 7:39, “Now when the Pharisee who had invited Him saw this, he spoke to himself, saying, ‘This Man, if He were a prophet, would know who and what manner of woman this is who is touching Him, for she is a sinner’.”

Luke 7:40, “And Jesus answered and said to him, ‘Simon, I have something to say to you.’ So he said, ‘Teacher, say it.’

Luke 7:41, “ ‘There was a certain creditor who had two debtors. One owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty.’ ”

Luke 7:42, “ ‘And when they had nothing with which to repay, he freely forgave them both. Tell Me, therefore, which of them will love him more?’ ”

Luke 7:43, “Simon answered and said, ‘I suppose the one whom he forgave more.’ And He said to him, ‘You have rightly judged.’ ”

Luke 7:44, “Then He turned to the woman and said to Simon, ‘Do you see this woman? I entered your house; you gave Me no water for My feet, but she has washed My feet with her tears and wiped them with the hair of her head.

Luke 7:45, “ ‘You gave Me no kiss, but this woman has not ceased to kiss My feet since the time I came in.

Luke 7:46, “ ‘You did not anoint My head with oil, but this woman has anointed My feet with fragrant oil.’ ”

Luke 7:47, “ ‘Therefore I say to you, her sins, which are many, are forgiven, for she loved much. But to whom little is forgiven, the same loves little.’ ”

Luke 7:48, “Then He said to her, ‘Your sins are forgiven.’ ”

Luke 7:49, “And those who sat at the table with Him began to say to themselves, ‘Who is this who even forgives sins?’

Luke 7:50, “Then He said to the woman, ‘Your faith has saved you. Go in peace.’ ”

Matt. 18:21, “Then Peter came to Him and said, ‘Lord, how often shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? Up to seven times?’

Matt. 18:22, “Jesus said to him, ‘I do not say to you, up to seven times, but up to seventy times seven.’ ”

Matt. 18:23, “Therefore the kingdom of heaven is like a certain king who wanted to settle accounts with his servants.

Matt. 18:24, “And when he had begun to settle accounts, one was brought to him who owed him ten thousand talents.”

Matt. 18:25, “But as he was not able to pay, his master commanded that he be sold, with his wife and children and all that he had, and that payment be made.

Matt. 18:26, “The servant therefore fell down before him, saying, ‘Master, have patience with me, and I will pay you all.’ ”

Matt. 18:27, “Then the master of that servant was moved with compassion, released him, and forgave him the debt.

Matt. 18:28, “But that servant went out and found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred denarii; and he laid hands on him and took him by the throat, saying, ‘Pay me what you owe!’ ”

Matt. 18:29, “So his fellow servant fell down at his feet and begged him, saying, ‘Have patience with me, and I will pay you all.’

Matt. 18:30, “And he would not, but went and threw him into prison till he should pay the debt.”

Matt. 18:31, “So when his fellow servants saw what had been done, they were very grieved, and came and told their master all that had been done.

Matt. 18:32, “Then his master, after he had called him, said to him, ‘You wicked servant! I forgave you all that debt because you begged me.’ ”

Matt. 18:33, “ ‘Should you not also have had compassion on your fellow servant, just as I had pity on you?’ ”

Matt. 18:34, “And his master was angry, and delivered him to the torturers until he should pay all that was due to him.

Matt. 18:35, “So My heavenly Father also will do to you if each of you, from his heart, does not forgive his brother his trespasses.”

Deut. 29:18, “so that there will not be among you a man or woman, or family or tribe, whose heart turns away today from the LORD our God, to go and serve the gods of those nations; that there will not be among you a root bearing poisonous fruit and wormwood.”

Heb. 12:16, “lest there be any fornicator or profane person like Esau, who for one morsel of food sold his birthright.

Heb. 12:17, “For you know that afterward, when he wanted to inherit the blessing, he was rejected, for he found no place for repentance, though he sought it diligently with tears.”
