years.

2 Kings 3:2, "And he did evil in the sight of the LORD, but not like his father and mother; for he put away the sacred pillar of Baal that his father had made.

2 Kings 3:3, "Nevertheless he persisted in the sins of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, who had made Israel sin; he did not depart from them." 2 Kings 3:4, "Now Mesha king of Moab was a sheepbreeder, and he regularly paid the king of Israel one hundred thousand lambs and the wool of one hundred thousand rams.

2 Kings 3:5, "But it happened, when Ahab died, that the king of Moab rebelled against the king of Israel."

## 2 Kings 3:6, "So King Jehoram went out of Samaria at that time and mustered all Israel.

2 Kings 3:7a, "Then he went and sent to Jehoshaphat king of Judah, saying, 'The king of Moab has rebelled against me. Will you go with me to fight against Moab?"

Jehoshaphat said to the king of Israel, 'I am as you are, my people as your people, my horses as your horses.'

1 Kings 22:5, "Also Jehoshaphat said to the king of Israel, 'Please inquire for the word of the LORD today.'" 2 Kings 3:7, "And he [Jehoshaphat] said, 'I will go up; I am as you are, my people as your people, my horses as your horses.'

2 Kings 3:8, "Then he [Jehoshaphat] said, Which way shall we go up?"

And he [Jehoram] answered, 'By way of the Wilderness of Edom.' "
