Six Affirmations of Confidence

- 1. Yhwh My Shepherd
- 2. I have no lack, I need nothing, I have no needs
- 3. He makes me lie down in green pastures
- 4. He leads me beside the still water
- 5. He restores my soul
- 6. He guides me in the path of +R for his name sake

hāsēr: A verb indicating to be lacking, to be needy; to decrease. In general, it refers to a failure of something to be fully complete, whole, sufficient (Ex. 16:18).

Exo 16:18, "When they measured it with an omer, he who had gathered much had no excess, and he who had gathered little had no lack; every man gathered as much as he should eat."

rā<u>b</u>aș:

"to lie down, to rest; to lay something down"

nāhal:

"to lead, to guide, to move along."

šû<u>b</u>:

"to turn, to return, to go back, to do again, to change, to withdraw, to bring back, to reestablish, to be returned, to bring back, to take, to restore, to recompense, to answer, to hinder."

nāḥāh:

"to lead, to guide, usually in the right direction or on the proper path." Ps 31:3, "For You are my rock and my fortress; for Your name's sake You will lead me and guide me."

ma ʻgāl

"encampment, circle of a camp (1 Sam. 17:20; 26:5, 7) the trails animals make encircling the hills."
