Acts 8:30, "So Philip ran to him, and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah, and said, 'Do you understand what you are reading?'

Acts 8:31, "And he said, 'How can I, unless someone guides me?' And he asked Philip to come up and sit with him."

Eight other English words translate the verb: instruct, prudent, understand, see, make wise, have success, act with insight or devotion.

The focus here is on the results of acting wisely, which is success.

The second line explains the prosperity as exaltation.

"Sprinkling" has reference to cleansing from sin (Isa. 52:15; 1 Pet. 1:2; Heb. 9:13–14) to obtain ritual purity. Its primary significance derives from its reference to "blood" sprinkling. This particular root is used with blood sprinklings which are lighter both as to how much blood is sprinkled and as to what is expiated (e.g., Lev. 4:6; 5:9; 14:7, 51; Num. 19:4). Expiation for unwitting sin (Lev. 4:6) and original sin (Lev. 16:14) are thus interrelated and yet differentiated (i.e., by the relationship between the "sprinkling" and the "smearing" cf. qāran).

Lev. 16:14, "He shall take some of the blood of the bull and <u>sprinkle</u> it with his finger on the mercy seat on the east side; and before the mercy seat he shall <u>sprinkle</u> <u>some of the blood</u> with his finger seven times."

Lev. 16:19, "Then he shall <u>sprinkle</u> some of the <u>blood</u> on it with his finger seven times, cleanse it, and consecrate it from the uncleanness of the children of Israel."

Num. 19:18, "A clean person shall take hyssop and dip it in the water, sprinkle it on the tent, on all the vessels, on the persons who were there, or on the one who touched a bone, the slain, the dead, or a grave."

Num. 19:21, "It shall be a perpetual statute for them. He who sprinkles the water of purification shall wash his clothes; and he who touches the water of purification shall be unclean until evening."

Ezek. 36:25, "Then I will sprinkle clean water on you, and you shall be clean; I will cleanse you from all your filthiness and from all your idols."
