
#### Organizational Diagram of the Biblical Church

- 1 Corinthians 4:16
- 1 Corinthians 11:1
- Philippians 4:9

## The Rationale for Moving from General to Specific in Imitation


- Jesus as Exemplar in general
  - 1 Corinthians 11:1 again
  - John 13:34-35
- Jesus as Exemplar in specific roles in an established authority structure
  - John 13: Leadership
  - Philippians 2:5-11: "Followership"
- Jesus as Exemplar in the special case of "pastor"
  - John 10
  - Hebrews 13:20
  - 1 Peter 2:25

- Continuation of Apostolic Authority Through Their Writings


# The Rubric

- Tier 1: Jesus: Savior, Head of the Church and church, Direct Revelation
- Tier 2: Apostles: Supervisory authority over multiple local churches, Special Revelation
- Tier 3: Elder/Overseer/Pastor: Supervisory Authority Over a Single Local Church
- Tier 4: The Flock of the Local Church: DI #1, 2, 3



#### The Rubric at Work in the Scriptures

- Acts 20:17-38, esp. v 28

  - –ἐν ὦ **Identity with Flock**

  - ποιμαίνειν τὴν ἐκκλησίαν τοῦ κυρίου
    καὶ θεοῦ,
    Responsibility: Shepherd
