
Matthew 4:17–25

Matt. 4:12, “Now when Jesus heard that John had been put in prison, He departed to Galilee.

Matt. 4:13, “And leaving Nazareth, He came and dwelt in Capernaum, which is by the sea, in the regions of Zebulun and Naphtali,”

KINGDOM OF HEROD THE GREAT

- Site of Herodian fortress
- ⊙ Decapolis city
- ⊙ Cities Salome gave to his sister
- ▭ Boundary of Herod the Great's Kingdom
- ▭ Boundary of domain given to Archelaus, son of Herod, by Augustus Caesar in (4 BC), when Herod died
- ▭ Boundary of domain given to Herod Antipas, son of Herod, by Augustus Caesar in (4 BC), when Herod died
- ▭ Boundary of domain given to Herod Philip, son of Herod, by Augustus Caesar in (4 BC), when Herod died
- ▭ Semi-independent municipality
- ▭ Syrian Province

Matt. 4:18, “And Jesus, walking by the Sea of Galilee, saw two brothers, Simon called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea; for they were fishermen.

Matt. 4:19, “Then He said to them, ‘Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men.’”

Matt. 4:20, “They immediately left their nets and followed Him.”

Matt. 28:19, “ ‘Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,

Matt. 28:20, “ ‘teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age.’ Amen.”

Matt. 4:21, “Going on from there, He saw two other brothers, James the son of Zebedee, and John his brother, in the boat with Zebedee their father, mending their nets. He called them,

Mark 8:34, “When He had called the people to Himself, with His disciples also, He said to them, ‘Whoever desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me.

Mark 8:35, “ ‘For whoever desires to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake and the gospel’s will save it.’ ”

Luke 14:26, “If anyone comes to Me, and does not hate his own father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters, yes, and even his own life, he cannot be My disciple.”

Luke 14:33, “So then, none of you can be My disciple who does not give up all his own possessions.”

Matt. 4:23, “And Jesus went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing all kinds of sickness and all kinds of disease among the people.”
