Three clauses express their desires regarding the worship of God and value of His kingdom. (6:9c–6:10)

Three petitions for our own needs (6:11–13)

Following explanation about forgiveness (6:14–15)

Matt. 6:14, "For if you forgive men their <u>trespasses</u>, your heavenly Father will also forgive you.

Matt. 6:15, "But if you do not forgive men their <u>trespasses</u>, neither will your Father forgive your <u>trespasses</u>."

παράπτωμα paraptōma acc neut plur trespass Matt. 6:14, "For if you <u>forgive</u> men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also <u>forgive</u> you. Matt. 6:15, "But if you <u>do not forgive</u> men their trespasses, neither will your Father <u>forgive</u> your trespasses.

FOUR Categories of <u>Forgiveness</u>

- 1. Forgiveness directed toward God, where the justice of God cancels the debt of sin. For all mankind without distinction. *Forensic forgiveness*
- 2. Forgiveness positionally *in Christ.* Forgiveness personally realized at the moment of salvation. Eph. 1:7; Col. 2:14
- 3. Experiential forgiveness. 1 John 1:9
- 4. Relational forgiveness. Eph. 4:32

FOUR Categories of <u>Forgiveness</u>

Eph. 1:7, "In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace;"

- 4. Relational forgiveness. Eph. 4:32

Col. 2:13,

"And you being dead [when you were dead] in your trespasses and uncircumcision of the flesh

[by, or when or because] He forgave you all trespasses

Col. 2:14, "[because] He had cancelled... when He took it ...

when He nailed it to the cross.

Col. 2:14, "[because] He had cancelled... when He took it ...

when He nailed it to the cross."

Acts 3:19, "Repent therefore and be converted, that your sins <u>may be blotted</u> out, so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord,"

Rev. 21:4, "And God <u>will wipe away</u> every tear from their eyes; there shall be no more death, nor sorrow, nor crying. There shall be no more pain, for the former things have passed away."

The Words for "Forgive"

ἀφίημι v. (*aphiēmi*), "let go, cancel, remit, leave, forgive" ἄφεσις n. (*aphesis*), "release, pardon, cancellation, forgiveness" cf., Matt. 18:32, "You wicked servant! I <u>forgave</u> you all that debt because you begged me."

Emphasizes the act of forgiveness

The Words for "Forgive"

ἀφίημι v. (*aphiēmi*), "let go, cancel, remit, leave, forgive" ἄφεσις n. (*aphēsis*), "release, pardon, cancellation, forgiveness" cf., Matt. 18:32, "You wicked servant! I forgave you all that debt because you begged me."

Emphasizes the act of forgiveness

χαρίζομαι (*charizomai*), show favour or kindness, give as a favour, to be gracious to someone, to pardon;

Emphasizes the *attitude* underlying forgiveness.

έξαλείφω *exaleiph* \bar{o} aor act part masc sing nom to plaster, wash over, wipe out

Mark 11:25, "And whenever you stand praying, if you have anything against anyone, forgive him, that your Father in heaven may also forgive you your trespasses.

Mark 11:26, "But if you do not forgive, neither will your Father in heaven forgive your trespasses." [KJV, NKJV, not in NASB, NIV, etc.]
