

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# Humility; Service How to Humble Yourself — Part 2



- 1 Pet. 5:1, "The elders who are among you I exhort, I who am a fellow elder and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, and also a partaker of the glory that will be revealed:
- 1 Pet. 5:2, "Shepherd the flock of God which is among you, serving as overseers, not by compulsion but willingly, not for dishonest gain but eagerly;
- 1 Pet. 5:3, "nor as being lords over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock;
- 1 Pet. 5:4, "and when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that does not fade away."

- 1 Pet. 5:5, "Likewise you younger people, submit yourselves to your elders. Yes, all of you be submissive to one another, and be clothed with humility, for 'God resists the proud, but gives grace to the humble.'
- 1 Pet. 5:6, "Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in due time,
- 1 Pet. 5:7, "casting all your care upon Him, for He cares for you."

Servant leadership is based on humility, but humility is based on obedience, not being rolled over.

When faced with the impending persecution and hostility, the leaders needed to be mature, solid, dependable, and courageous.

- 3 Commands/Responsibilities
- 1 Pet. 5:5, "Likewise you younger people, submit yourselves (aor pass imp 2P)

all of you <u>be submissive</u> to one another, and <u>be clothed</u> with humility, (aor mid imp 2P) the reason

for [quotes Prov. 3:34]

'God resists the proud, but gives grace to the humble.'

WHY?

"for [because] He cares for you."

ἐγκομβόομαι egkomboomai aor mid impera 2 plur to put on, to tie something on. In the AV it has the idea of putting on an apron, i.e., the apron of a slave.

Matt. 18:4, "Therefore whoever humbles himself as this little child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven.

Matt. 18:5, "Whoever receives one little child like this in My name receives Me."

Matt. 18:1, "At that time the disciples came to Jesus, saying, 'Who then is greatest in the kingdom of heaven?'

Matt. 18:2, "Then Jesus called a little child to Him, set him in the midst of them,

Matt. 18:3, "and said, 'Assuredly, I say to you, unless you are converted [strepho—to turn] and become as little children, you will by no means enter the kingdom of heaven.'



# **Arrogance Skills**



ὑπερήφανος huperēphanos acc masc plur proud, arrogant

Rom. 1:30, "backbiters, haters of God, violent, proud, boasters, inventors of evil things, disobedient to parents,"

2 Tim. 3:2, "For men will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy,"

James 4:6, "But He gives more grace. Therefore He says: 'God resists the proud, but gives grace to the humble.'" Prov. 3:34, "Surely He scorns the scornful, but gives grace to the humble." [NKJV]

Prov. 3:34, "Though He scoffs at the scoffers, yet He gives grace to the afflicted." [NASB 95]

Prov. 3:34, "Although he is scornful to arrogant scoffers, yet he shows favor to the humble." [NET]

## Four Contrasts in Prov. 3:32-35

1. The *perverse* vs. the upright *yashar*, the upright, righteous, the one who does right or proper things.

## Prov. 3:32,

"For the <u>perverse</u> person is an abomination to the LORD, But His secret counsel is with the <u>upright</u>."

לות nif part masc sing abs to be morally crooked, and he lacks sense, and is thus a scoffer of God.

# The Values of the Upright Person

Prov. 3:21, "My son, let them not depart from your eyes—Keep sound wisdom and discretion;"

Prov. 4:21, "Do not let them depart from your eyes; Keep them in the midst of your heart;"

## The Values of the Perverse Person

Isa. 5:20, "Woe to those who call evil good, and good evil; Who put darkness for light, and light for darkness; Who put bitter for sweet, and sweet for bitter!"

Prov. 2:15, "Whose ways are crooked, and who are devious in their paths;"

Prov. 14:2, "He who walks in his uprightness fears the LORD, but he who is perverse in his ways despises Him."

Isa. 30:12, "Therefore thus says the Holy One of Israel: 'Because you despise this word, and trust in oppression and perversity, and rely on them,' "

The second contrast: wicked vs. the righteous.

Prov. 3:33,

"The curse of the LORD is on the house of the wicked,

But He blesses the home of the just."

רְשְׁע rasha masc sing abs wicked

צַּדִּיק tzaddiq masc plur abs righteous

## 3. The scornful vs. the humble

Prov. 3:34,
"Surely He scorns [mocks] the scornful,
[insolent]
But gives grace to the humble."

a. The kesil, the fool, the dullard

Jer. 10:8, "But they are altogether dull-hearted and foolish; A wooden idol is a worthless doctrine."

b. Is an evil or ewil, dull, obstinate, makes wrong decisions.

Prov. 1:7, "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge, But fools despise wisdom and instruction."

#### c. Is the nabal

נְבֵל (*nābal*) II, be senseless, foolish. Thinks and acts as if there is no God.

Psa. 14:1, "The fool has said in his heart, 'There is no God.' They are corrupt, they have done abominable works, there is none who does good." cf., Psa. 53:1 d. The worse level is the scornful.
An even stronger word in Prov. is אָלִי,
often translated "scoffer."

Insolent, ridicules God.

Prov. 14:9, "Fools mock at sin, but among the upright there is favor."

Prov. 19:28, "A disreputable witness scorns justice, and the mouth of the wicked devours iniquity."

Prov. 3:34,
"Surely He scorns [mocks] the scornful,
[insolent]
But gives grace to the humble."

"Humble" is not economically low, but subordinate to authority.

Zech. 9:9, "Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your King is coming to you; He is just and having salvation, lowly and riding on a donkey, a colt, the foal of a donkey."

4. The fourth contrast: wise vs. fools.

Prov. 3:35, "The wise shall inherit glory, But shame shall be the legacy of fools (kesil)."

The "proud" are the fools, that are arrogantly insolent toward God by rejecting His authority and pursuing their own path in life.

The "humble" are those submitted to God's authority.

Num. 12:3, "(Now the man Moses was very humble, more than all men who were on the face of the earth.)"

Mic. 6:8, "He has shown you, O man, what is good; And what does the LORD require of you but to do justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God?"

2 Sam. 22:28, "You will save the humble people; But Your eyes are on the haughty, that You may bring them down."

Zech. 9:9, "Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your King is coming to you; He is just and having salvation, lowly and riding on a donkey, a colt, the foal of a donkey."

Phil. 2:3, "Let nothing be done through selfish ambition or conceit, but in *lowliness of mind* let each esteem others better than himself."

ταπεινοφροσύνη tapeinophrosunē dat fem sing humility Phil. 2:5, "Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus,

Phil. 2:6, "who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God,"

Phil. 2:7, "but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, and coming in the likeness of men.

Phil. 2:8, "And being found in appearance as a man, He <u>humbled Himself</u> and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross."

ταπεινόω tapeinoō aor act indic 3 sing to humble, submit
