

"Resist, to stand against" or "to oppose"

Three times in the New Testament believers are told to *resist* the devil (1 Pet. 5:9, James 4:7; Eph. 6:13)

- 6:11 ἴστημι *histēmi* to stand, place, set up; aor: to stand still in a stationary position; to resist, or hold one's ground.
- 6:13 ἀνθίστημι anthistēmi, to resist, to stand against, to oppose.
- 6:14 ἵστημι *histēmi* to stand, place, set up; aor: to stand still in a stationary position; to resist, or hold one's ground.
