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Claim: Universities began in the early Middle Ages in the West.

Rationale: Buddhism, Hinduism, and Islam did not develop universities, because their metaphysical beliefs prevented the development of an epistemology that would have produced a university in the way of the development in the West. "Why did my university in Allahabad have a church, but not a Hindu temple or a Muslim mosque? Because the university was invented and established by Christians."

"Universities, like cathedrals and parliaments, are a product of the middle ages. 



Ex. 19:1, "In the third month after the children of Israel had gone out of the land of Egypt, on the same day, they came to the Wilderness of Sinai.

Ex. 19:2, "For they had departed from Rephidim, had come to the Wilderness of Sinai, and camped in the wilderness. So Israel camped there before the mountain." Ex. 19:3, "And Moses went up to God, and the LORD called to him from the mountain, saying, 'Thus you shall say to the house of Jacob, and tell the children of Israel:

Ex. 19:4, "'"You have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I bore you on eagles' wings and brought you to Myself."'"



Ex. 19:5, " ' "Now therefore, if you will indeed obey My voice and keep My covenant, then you shall be a special treasure to Me above all people; for all the earth is Mine.

Ex. 19:6, "'"And you shall be to Me <u>a</u> <u>kingdom of priests and a holy nation</u>." These are the words which you shall speak to the children of Israel.'"

Ex. 19:7, "So Moses came and called for the elders of the people, and laid before them all these words which the LORD commanded him.

Ex. 19:8, "Then all the people answered together and said, 'All that the LORD has spoken we will do.' So Moses brought back the words of the people to the LORD." Ex. 19:9, "And the LORD said to Moses, 'Behold, I come to you in the thick cloud, that the people may hear when I speak with you, and believe you forever.' So Moses told the words of the people to the LORD." Ex. 19:10, "Then the LORD said to Moses, 'Go to the people and <u>consecrate</u> them today and tomorrow, and <u>let them wash</u> their clothes.

Ex. 19:11, "'And let them be ready for the third day. For on the third day the LORD will come down upon Mount Sinai in the sight of all the people.'"

Ex. 19:13, "'"Not a hand shall touch him, but he shall surely be stoned or shot with an arrow; whether man or beast, he shall not live." When the trumpet sounds long, they shall come near the mountain.'" Ex. 19:14, "So Moses went down from the mountain to the people and <u>sanctified</u> the people, and they washed their clothes.

Ex. 19:15, "And he said to the people, 'Be ready for the third day; do not come near your wives.'"

Ex. 19:18, "Now Mount Sinai was completely in smoke, because the LORD descended upon it in fire. Its smoke ascended like the smoke of a furnace, and the whole mountain quaked greatly." <u>Deut. 4:12,</u> "And the LORD spoke to you out of the midst of the fire. You heard the sound of the words, but saw no form; you only heard a voice.

Deut. 4:13, "So He declared to you His covenant which He commanded you to perform, the Ten Commandments; and He wrote them on two tablets of stone." Ex. 19:19, "And when the blast of the trumpet sounded long and became louder and louder, Moses spoke, and God answered him by voice.

Ex. 19:20, "Then the LORD came down upon Mount Sinai, on the top of the mountain. And the LORD called Moses to the top of the mountain, and Moses went up." Ex. 24:1, "Now He said to Moses, 'Come up to the LORD, you and Aaron, Nadab and Abihu, and seventy of the elders of Israel, and worship from afar.

Ex. 24:2, " 'And Moses alone shall come near the LORD, but they shall not come near; nor shall the people go up with him.' "
