2 Sam. 22:51,

"He is the tower of salvation to His king, and shows mercy to His anointed, To David and his descendants forevermore."

Literal Prophecy-Literal Fulfillment

Matt. 2:5, "So they said to him, 'In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it is written by the prophet:

Matt. 2:6, " "But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are not the least among the rulers of Judah; For out of you shall come a Ruler Who will shepherd My people Israel." "

Mic. 5:2, "But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are little among the thousands of Judah, <u>yet out of you shall come forth to Me the One to be Ruler in Israel, Whose goings forth are from of old, from everlasting."</u>

Literal Historical Event-Typological Fulfillment

Matt. 2:15, "and was there until the death of Herod, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the Lord through the prophet, saying, 'Out of Egypt I called My Son.'"

Hos. 11:1, "When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called My son."

Literal History-Application

Matt. 2:17, "Then was fulfilled what was spoken by Jeremiah the prophet, saying:

Matt. 2:18, "'A voice was heard in Ramah, lamentation, weeping, and great mourning, Rachel weeping for her children, refusing to be comforted, because they are no more."

Jer. 31:15, "Thus says the LORD: 'A voice was heard in Ramah, lamentation and bitter weeping, Rachel weeping for her children, refusing to be comforted for her children, because they are no more.' "

Summary

Based on the Masoretic Text:

"These are the last words of David: the declaration of David son of Jesse, the declaration of the man raised on high, the one anointed by the God of Jacob, the favorite singer of Israel."

Based on other ancient translations and texts

"These are the last words of David: the declaration of David son of Jesse, and the declaration of the man raised up concerning

the Messiah [Anointed One] of the God of Jacob, and the Delightful One of the songs of Israel."

This translation and interpretation hinges on the Masoretic Text reading 'āl, "on high." However, the Septuagint translates epi ("concerning"), apparently reading the same Hebrew consonants but a different Hebrew vowel: pathah (yielding 'al) rather than qamas (yielding 'āl). This slight vowel difference results in a substantial difference in translation:

"The effect of the difference in the length of the vowel is such that the title 'anointed one' in the Masoretic Text refers to King David, whereas in other, non-Masoretic versions of the text, David's words are taken as a reference to the Messiah (cf., 2 Sam. 22:51)."
