The Problem: What we were before we were saved, Eph. 2:1–3

The Solution: God's love and mercy, grace in action, regenerate, raise, and seat us positionally in Christ, Eph. 2:4–9

The Purpose: We are saved, created in Christ Jesus, for good works, Eph. 2:10

John 5:25, “Most assuredly, I say to you, the hour is coming, and now is, when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God; and those who hear will live.”

2 Cor. 4:4, “whose minds the god of this age has blinded, who do not believe, lest the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine on them.”

Demon Influence: The effect on the thinking of any person which imitates the thinking of Satan in his fall.

Equivalent to the thinking of the world system (*kosmic system*).

Arrogance toward God in two areas:

Autonomy: Independence from God.

Antagonism: Rejection and hostility toward God, His plan, and all believers.

All unbelievers are demon influenced.

Believers are demon influenced when thinking according to the world (human viewpoint) instead of the Word of God (divine viewpoint).

Demon Influence: The effect on the thinking of any person which imitates the thinking of Satan in his fall.

Equivalent to the thinking of the world system (*kosmic system*).

Direct Demon Influence: Examples of Mormonism and Islam

Indirect Demon Influence: All human viewpoint philosophical systems, religions
