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Worshipping God Fear of the Lord God is not "Safe" Ephesians 5:18-22; Isaian 6:1-4 THE WEALTH, WALK & WARFARE OF THE BELIEVER

- "But shall we see him?" asked Susan.
- "Why, Daughter of Eve, that's what I brought you here for. I'm to lead you where you shall meet him," said Mr. Beaver.
- "Is—is he a man?" asked Lucy.

John 15:14, "You are My friends if you do whatever I command you.

John 15:15, "No longer do I call you servants, for a servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all things that I heard from My Father I have made known to you."

Rev. 1:17, "And when I saw Him, I fell at His feet as dead. But He laid His right hand on me, saying to me, 'Do not be afraid; I am the First and the Last.'" 5. B. We are commanded to be filled by means of the Spirit (passive command) (Eph. 5:18).

πληρόω *plēroō*2 plur pres <u>passive</u>

And to "let the Word of Christ dwell within you" (Col. 3:16).

ἐνοικέω *enoikeō* 3 sing pres active imperative to dwell in

Eph. 5:18 describes the means. Col. 3:16 describes the content.

Results of being filled by the Spirit:

Eph. 5:19, "speaking to one another in <u>psalms and hymns and</u> spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord, Eph. 5:20, "giving thanks always for <u>all</u> things to God the Father <u>in</u> the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, Eph. 5:21, "submitting to one another in the fear of God Eph. 5:22, "Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord."

Results of the Word dwelling richly:

Col 3:16b, "... teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord. Col. 3:17, "And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him. Col. 3:18, "Wives, submit to <u>your own husbands</u>, as is fitting in the Lord."

Eph. 5:18, "And do not be drunk with wine, in which is dissipation; but be filled with the Spirit,

Eph. 5:19, "speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord,

Eph. 5:20, "giving thanks always for all things to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ,

Eph. 5:21, "submitting to one another in the fear of God."

Grammatically what we have here is this: Command: Be filled by means of the Holy Spirit (present passive imperative)

This is followed by

- 1. Speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs [anarthrous present active participle].
- 2, 3. Singing and making melody in your heart (thinking) to the Lord [anarthrous present active participle].
- 4. Giving thanks always for all things to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ [anarthrous present active participle].
- 5. Submitting to one another in the Lord [anarthrous present active participle].

*When a participle does not have an article with it, then it is adverbial, modifying a main verb. The main verb here is "be filled."

Col. 3:16, "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord.

Col. 3:17, "And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him.

Command: Let the Word of Christ dwell richly within you. The finite verb, is *enoikeo*, to make a home, dwell in

Three participles follow:

- 1. admonishing
- 2. teaching
- 3. singing

Verse 17 is a separate sentence but also like Eph. 5:19, bring thanksgiving into the list of results.

4. giving thanks

It is more likely that <u>Paul is stating what will happen when one is filled</u> by the Spirit. As dissipation issues from drunkenness, so also speaking, singing songs and psalms, giving thanks, and submitting issue from the filling by the Spirit. Accordingly, these could be categorized as participles of manner or possibly as participles of attendant circumstance. ...

It is better to see them as participles of result. The resultant characteristics suggest visible manifestation of one filled by the Spirit. Furthermore, participles of result are normally in the present tense and follow the main verb as here. The present tense of the participles most likely indicates repetition or progression of the characteristics described by these five participles. ... The repetition or progression of these characteristics is evidence that the believer is being filled by the Spirit.
