1. Sufficient means enough, adequate; it meets the needs.

Theologically, this means that the Scripture informs us of all that we need to know to face and handle whatever circumstances we find ourselves in.

Psa. 1:1, "Blessed is the man Who walks not in the counsel of the ungodly,

> Nor stands in the path of sinners, Nor sits in the seat of the scornful;

Psa. 1:2, "But his delight is in the law of the LORD,

And in His law he meditates day and night."

Psa. 1:2, "But his <u>delight</u> is in the law of the LORD,

And in His law he meditates day and night."

ץ בַּהְ (ḥēpeṣ) delight, desire, will EDBT, says of hēpes, "to bend towards, to be inclined towards [an object or person]"

Isa. 53:10, "Yet it pleased [delighted?] the LORD to bruise Him;

He has put Him to grief.

When You make His soul an offering for sin,

He shall see His seed, He shall prolong His days,

And the pleasure of the LORD shall prosper in His hand."

Psa. 1:2, "But his delight is in the law of the LORD,

And in His law he <u>meditates</u> day and night."

Psa. 1:3, "He shall be like a tree
Planted by the rivers of water,
That brings forth its fruit in its season,

Psa. 1:4, "The ungodly are not so, But are like the chaff which the wind drives away.

Psa. 1:5, "Therefore the ungodly shall not stand in the judgment,

Jeremiah 17:5, "Thus says the Lord: 'Cursed is the man who trusts in man and makes flesh his strength, whose heart turns away from the Lord.'"

Curse

Jeremiah 17:5, "Thus says the Lord: 'Cursed is the man who trusts [relies, depends on] in man and makes flesh his strength, whose heart turns away [abandons, ignores, withdraws from] from the Lord."

אַרְר ('ārar') to bind with a curse.

רבּשְׁ (bāṭaḥ) trust in, feel safe, be confident, to rely on, firm or reliable. סוּר (sûr) turn aside, to defect, to abandon, defect, depart, withdraw from.

Illustration

Jeremiah 17:6, "He is like a shrub in the desert, and shall not see any good come. He shall dwell in the parched places of the wilderness, in an uninhabited salt land."

Blessing

Jeremiah 17:7, "Blessed is the man who trusts in the Lord, whose hope is the Lord."

קבְטַּת (mibṭaḥ) trust, "hope" in NKJV

Illustration

Jeremiah 17:8, "He is like a tree planted by water, that sends out its roots by the stream, and does not fear when heat comes, for its leaves remain green, and is not anxious in the year of drought, for it does not cease to bear fruit."

Warning

Jeremiah 17:9, "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately sick; who can understand it?"

John 10:10, "The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly."

John 17:3, "And this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent."
