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



Controlled by the lust patterns of the sin nature, i.e., uncleanness, like walking through a sewer or cesspool or septic tank.

Despise authorities, i.e., glories, all spiritual authority including elect angels and demons.

Presumptuous, bold Self-willed, arrogant Not afraid, revile, speak evil of authorities




- C. Peter Wagner (August 15, 1930 October 21, 2016)

- Founder, International Coalition of Apostles
- Used phrase "New Apostolic Reformation" (1996) – an advance upon the third-wave movement



False apostles, Rev. 2:2 (to *Ephesus*) "I know your deeds and your toil and perseverance, and that you cannot tolerate evil men, and you put to the test those who call themselves apostles, and they are not, and you found them to be false."
