

People and Groups in 2 Peter

- 1. Peter, the writer, this will be represented by 1st person pronouns, "I" or "we."
- 2. His audience, believers, "those who have obtained like precious faith with us by the righteousness of our God and Savior Jesus Christ" (1:1, 2:1, 3). 2nd person pronouns: you (sg) y'all (pl)
- 3. False teachers, 2 Pet. 2:1. Indicated by 3rd person plural "they," "them". The False Teachers (FT) are still the focus of 2:12 "these," 2:17 "these," "whom," 2:18 "they allure, entice," 2:19 "they themselves."

People and Groups in 2 Peter

- 4. But who are "the ones who escape" and who are "those who live in error?"
 - 2 Peter 2:18: who are the "the ones" and who are the "from those?"
 - "... through debauchery, the ones who have actually escaped from those who live in error. [~RD]

- 2 Pet. 2:12, "But these [men, false teachers], like irrational creatures of instinct born to be caught and destroyed, speak evil of the things they do not understand, and [they] will be destroyed in their own corruption.
- 2 Pet. 2:13, "and will receive the wages of unrighteousness, as those who count it pleasure to carouse in the daytime. They are spots and blemishes, carousing in their own deceptions while they feast with you,
- 2 Pet. 2:14, "having eyes full of adultery and that cannot cease from sin, enticing unstable souls. They have a heart trained in covetous practices, and are accursed child en.
- 2 Pet. 2:15, "They have forsaken the right way and [they have] gone astray, following the way of Balaam the son of Beor, who loved the wages of unrighteousness,
- 2 Pet. 2:16, "but he was rebuked for his iniquity: a dumb donkey speaking with a man's voice restrained the madness of the prophet.
- 2 Pet. 2:17, "These are wells without water, clouds carried by a tempest, for whom is reserved the blackness of darkness forever."

2 Pet. 2:18, "For when they [FT] speak great swelling words of emptiness, they [FT] seduce [whom? #2] through the lusts of the flesh, through debauchery, the ones who have actually escaped from those who live in error." [~RD]

2 Pet. 2:19, "While they [FT] promise them [seduced ones (SO)] liberty, they themselves [FT] are slaves of corruption; for by whom a person is overcome, by him also he is brought into bondage."

they = FT them = the seduced ones they themselves = the FT 2 Pet. 2:20, "For if, after they have escaped the pollutions of the world through the knowledge of the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, they are again entangled in them and overcome, the latter end is worse for them than the beginning."

John 8:31, "Then Jesus said to those Jews who believed Him, 'If you abide in My word, you are My disciples indeed.

John 8:32, "'And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.'"

John 8:28, "Then Jesus said to them, 'When you lift up the Son of Man, then you will know that I am He, and that I do nothing of Myself; but as My Father taught Me, I speak these things.

John 8:29, "'And He who sent Me is with Me. The Father has not left Me alone, for I always do those things that please Him.'

John 8:30, "As He spoke these words, many believed in Him."

John 8:31, "Then Jesus said to those Jews who believed Him, 'If you abide in My word, you are My disciples indeed.

John 8:32, "'And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.'"

John 8:33, "They answered Him, 'We are Abraham's descendants, and have never been in bondage to anyone. How can You say, "You will be made free"?"

John 8:34, "Jesus answered them, 'Most assuredly, I say to you, whoever <u>commits</u> sin is a slave of sin.

John 8:35, "'And a slave does not abide in the house forever, but a son abides forever.

John 8:36, "'Therefore if the Son makes you free, you shall be free indeed.'"

Rom. 6:6, "because we know this, that our old self was crucified together with Him, that the body of sin [the tyranny of the sin nature] might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves of sin."

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Rom. 6:7, "For he who has died has been freed from sin.

Rom. 6:8, "Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with Him,"

Rom. 6:16, "Do you not know that to whom you present yourselves slaves to obey, you are that one's slaves whom you obey, whether of sin leading to death, or of obedience leading to righteousness?

Rom. 6:17, "But God be thanked that though you were slaves of sin, yet you obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine to which you were delivered."

Rom. 6:18, "And having been set free from sin, you became slaves of righteousness.

Rom. 6:19, "I speak in human terms because of the weakness of your flesh. For just as you presented your members as slaves of uncleanness, and of lawlessness leading to more lawlessness, so now present your members as slaves of righteousness for holiness."

Rom. 6:22, "But now having been set free from sin, and having become slaves of God, you have your fruit to holiness, and the end, everlasting life."

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"Therefore to suggest that 2 Peter 2:20–21 refers to superficial or inaccurate knowledge would necessitate much more evidence from both Old Testament usage and Hellenistic literature than is forthcoming. In fact, it is difficult, if not impossible, to find one good, clear example of either γνώσις [gnosis] or ἐπίγνωσις [epignosis] referring to superficial knowledge which later turns out to be false. This strengthens the view that the persons in view in 2 Peter 2:18-22 are new believers, not false teachers."
