Do not fall into error, but grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. 2 Peter 3:14–18

2 Pet. 3:14, “Therefore, beloved, looking forward to these things, be diligent to be found by Him in peace, without spot and blameless;

2 Pet. 3:15, “and consider that the longsuffering of our Lord is salvation—as also our beloved brother Paul, according to the wisdom given to him, has written to you,

2 Pet. 3:16, “as also in all his epistles, speaking in them of these things, in which are some things hard to understand, which untaught and unstable people twist to their own destruction, as they do also the rest of the Scriptures.”

Two Commands

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σπουδάζω *spoudázō*;

2 plur aor act impera

“to be make every effort, to be eager, strive for; it has a sense of intensity or passion.” (cf., Hoehner, *Ephesians*, Eph. 4:3)

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Used 11× in 11 verses; 7 in Paul, 1 in Hebrews, 3 in 2 Peter

John 19:6, “Therefore, when the chief priests and officers saw Him, they cried out, saying, ‘Crucify Him, crucify Him!’ Pilate said to them, ‘You take Him and crucify Him, for I find no fault in Him.’ ”

Acts 13:28, “And though they found no cause for death in Him, they asked Pilate that He should be put to death.”

Acts 24:20, “Or else let those who are here themselves say if they found any wrongdoing in me while I stood before the council,”

1 Pet. 1:7, “that the genuineness of your faith, being much more precious than gold that perishes, though it is tested by fire, may be found to praise, honor, and glory at the revelation of Jesus Christ,”

Is this positional or experiential?

1. Positional righteousness is ours by faith, not by being diligent or making every effort.

Rom. 4:2, “For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not before God.

Rom. 4:3, “For what does the Scripture say? ‘Abraham believed God, and it was accounted to him for righteousness.’ ”

2. However, there is an experiential righteousness which we are also to pursue.

2 Tim. 2:22, “Flee also youthful lusts; but pursue righteousness, faith, love, peace with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart.”

2 Pet. 3:14, “Therefore, beloved, while you think about these future things, make every effort to be found by Him in peace, without spot and blameless;”

On the one hand we have a positional peace ...

Rom. 5:1, “Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.”

On the one hand we have a positional peace ...

Eph. 2:14, “For He Himself is our peace, who has made both one, and has broken down the middle wall of separation,

Eph. 2:15, “having abolished in His flesh the enmity, that is, the law of commandments contained in ordinances, so as to create in Himself one new man from the two, thus making peace,”

But on the other hand, we have an experiential peace as the result of walking by means of the Spirit, spiritual growth.

Gal. 5:22, “But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness,

Gal. 5:23, “gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law.”

Rom. 8:6, “For to be carnally minded is death [sin-nature-controlled thinking], but to be spiritually minded [thinking influenced by the Holy Spirit] is life and peace.”

Rom. 14:19, “Therefore let us pursue the things which make for peace and the things by which one may edify another.”

Rom. 15:13, “Now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace by believing, that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.”

2 Cor. 13:11, “Finally, brethren, farewell. Become complete. Be of good comfort, be of one mind, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you.”

Phil. 4:6–7, “Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God and the peace of God which surpasses all comprehension shall defend your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.”

Phil. 4:8, “Finally, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy—meditate on these things.

Phil. 4:9, “The things which you learned and received and heard and saw in me, these do, and the God of peace will be with you.”

2 Tim. 2:22, “Flee also youthful lusts; but pursue righteousness, faith, love, peace with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart.”

2 Thess. 3:16, “Now may the Lord of peace Himself give you peace always in every way. The Lord be with you all.”

1 Pet. 3:11, “Let him turn away from evil and do good; Let him seek peace and pursue it.”

When we don't have that experiential growth producing peace ...

1 John 2:28, “And now, little children, abide in Him, that when He appears, we may have confidence and not be ashamed before Him at His coming.” ~NKJV

1 Pet. 1:19, “but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot.”

1 Tim. 6:14, “that you keep this commandment without spot, blameless until our Lord Jesus Christ’s appearing,”

James 1:27, “Pure and undefiled religion before God and the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their trouble, and to keep oneself unspotted from the world.”
