 - offense "proscope" without any stumbling block
 - blamed "momaomai" to malign
- B. Commending themselves ..., v. 4a
 - commending "sunistao" giving undeniable evidence

 - 1. In hardships, persecution, & inconveniences
 - 2. By a pure walk with God, vv. 6-7

"unequally yoked together with" - heterozugeo v. 14a

"unbelievers" - apistos = no faith

B. Five rhetorical questions: vv. 14–16

- 1. What fellowship has righteousness with lawlessness? v. 14b
- 2. What communion has light with darkness? v. 14c
- 3. What accord has Christ with Belial? v. 15a
- 4. What part has a believer with an unbeliever? v. 15b
- 5. What agreement has the temple of God with idols? v. 16a

C. Application:

"For you are the temple of the living God." v. 16b

You - umeis, second person plural - you all - the church

Temple - naos = The Holy Place and the Holy of Holies
