What is a Divine Institution?

Absolute social structures instituted by God for the entire human race—believers and unbelievers alike.

Designed by God for the "perpetuation, preservation, protection, and prosperity of the human race."

"the protection, conservation, fostering, and improvement of human life." ~Martin Luther

A Divine Institution is not a social construct.

Nimrod

1 Chron. 1:10, "Cush begot Nimrod; he began to be a mighty one on the earth."

Micah 5:6, "They shall waste with the sword the land of Assyria, and the land of Nimrod at its entrances; Thus He shall deliver us from the Assyrian, when he comes into our land and when he treads within our borders."
