

God's Holiness: He is <u>one of a kind, distinct, unique</u>. He alone is God.

What Does the Bible Claim for Itself?





1. The Bible claims to be the objective communication of God to man.

It does not claim the *ideas* are inspired ... It does not claim that the Scripture contains the Word of God. It is the Word of God. It does not claim that it becomes the Word of God when you have a religious experience with the **Bible**.

It claims to <u>record the exact words</u> of God.

"God said" is used 46 × in the Bible; "God spoke" 12×

Ex. 34:10, "Then God said, 'Behold, I am going to make a covenant. Before all your people I will perform miracles which have not been produced in all the earth, nor among any of the nations; and all the people among whom you live will see the working of the LORD, for it is a fearful thing that I am going to perform with you.' "

Claims that the Bible precisely quotes God:

"the Lord said" 233×; "the Lord spoke" 133×; "says the Lord" 502×

<u>Isa. 1:18,</u> "'Come now, and let us reason together,' says the LORD, 'Though your sins are as scarlet, they will be as white as snow; Though they are red like crimson, they will be like wool.'"

So the Bible claims that God objectively communicates something to man well over 2,671× (Old Testament), 306× (God), 62× (Holy Spirit), 93× [Jesus (Acts-Rev.)], 1,607× (Gospels) (New Testament), based on Logos search query.

2. The Bible claims to be from God.

2. The Bible claims to be a unique inspired revelation

Literally: Every prophecy of Scripture does not come about from his [the human prophet's] own explanation/interpretation.


3. Thus inspiration includes the minute details of Scripture. Inspiration extends to the grammar and the details of the words.

Matt. 5:18, "For truly I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not the smallest letter or stroke shall pass away from the Law, until all is accomplished." Matt. 22:29, "But Jesus answered and said to them, 'You are mistaken, not understanding the Scriptures, or the power of God.'

4. Thus the Bible makes a claim to be absolute Truth. Not merely truth that is the result of human observation, but a universal truth that goes beyond all other truth. A truth by which all other standards may be evaluated.

5. As Absolute Truth the Bible has everlasting value.

6. As Absolute Truth it is the source of guidance and direction.

7. Inspiration extends to the individual words and the forms of the words. This is known as *verbal* inspiration. That it extends to the whole of Scripture is known as *plenary*.

Plenary: complete in every respect, full, absolute, unqualified.

Verbal: refers to every word.



The Bible Claims: to be absolute Truth, from God, not originating with humans



1. We do not say "prove" because proof can take different avenues. But in constructing a proof, one appeals to "higher laws" or a higher authority. Yet, if the Bible is the Word of God as it claims it be, then what could conceivably be a higher authority?
