

# 2. Only believers who advance in the Christian life are overcomers.

### Three Stages of Salvation

#### PHASE ONE

#### Justification **Belief in Christ's** death for salvation

Saved from **Penalty of Sin** "You were saved"

PHASE Two

Spiritual Life **Believing Scripture, i.e.,** the FRD, for spiritual growth

> Saved from **Power of Sin** "You are being saved"

Saved from **Presence of Sin** "You will be saved"



### Summary

- 1. To know Him is to have love for God.
- 2. Knowing Him is not = believing in Christ as savior.
- 3. Knowing Him is a process that begins at salvation.
- 4. Example: Philip was saved, but did not know Christ, John 14:9.
- believer still spends a lot of time loving the world.

5. Therefore, a believer must come to know God, know His Word, apply His Word, to come to love God, which in turn is manifested by biblical love for other believers. 6. So the immature believer does not yet know God or love God, which means the immature, or out-of-fellowship

#### Summary

- 7. The believer who loves one another meets two prerequisites, born from God and knows God.

What is overcome in this passage?

The world: κόσμος kosmos masc sing acc world, the order or structure of Satan's thinking, i.e., arrogance in reference to himself and antagonism toward God.

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νικάω *nikaō* Perfect tense: completed action

Jesus completed His victory over the world *before* He went to the cross.

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


### What Did Christ Overcome?

- 2. The "world" or worldliness is different from sin.
- 3. On the cross Jesus Christ paid the sin penalty.
- 4. In His life He overcame the thinking of the world, setting the precedent for <u>our</u> victory over the thinking of the world.
- 5. Thus, overcoming the world is a post-salvation, Phase 2, function of spiritual growth, not positional truth in Christ, Phase 1.

1. Before Christ went to the cross He overcame the world.

### James 3:15, "This wisdom does not descend from above, but *is* <u>earthly</u>, sensual, demonic."

ἐπίγειος *epigeios* fem sing nom earthly, terrestrial "earthly" = oriented to the Earth, rather than Heaven. Php. 4:19

### <u>James 3:15,</u> "This wisdom does not descend from above, but *is* earthly, <u>soulish</u>, demonic."

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ψυχικός psuchikos fem sing nom soulish, not spiritual; of the soul, or soulish, e.g., the thinking of the unbeliever, according to a nonbiblical worldview (naturalism, deism, existentialism, postmodernism).

δαιμονιώδης *daimoniōdēs* fem sing nom demonic– related to the rebellious mentality of Satan and the demons.

ψυχικός psuchikos fem sing nom soulish, not spiritual; of the soul, or soulish, e.g., the thinking of the unbeliever, according to a nonbiblical worldview (naturalism, deism, existentialism, postmodernism).
