

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Biblical Defense of Our Souls Philippians 4:4–5



- Php. 4:4 ¶ "Rejoice in the Lord always. Again I will say, rejoice!
- Php. 4:5 ¶ "Let your gentleness be known to all men. The Lord is at hand.
- Php. 4:6 ¶ "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God;
- Php. 4:7 "and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

What is the key idea here?

Rejoice, but more ...

Mental attitude; mindset; thinking

Thinking about life's situations based on God's truth, not man's ideas, while walking by means of the Spirit and claiming promises.


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

The command to rejoice in Php. 4:4 is related to

Php. 3:1, "Finally, my brethren, rejoice in the Lord. For me to write the same things to you is not tedious, but for you it is safe."

In Php. 4:5, the command is to let your graciousness be known to all men. This is grace orientation, which becomes the foundation for developing a biblical love for all mankind.

Php. 2:2, "fulfill my joy by being like-minded, having the same love, being of one accord, of one mind.

Php. 2:3, "Let nothing be done through selfish ambition or conceit, but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than himself.

Php. 2:4, "Let each of you look out not only for his own interests, but also for the interests of others."

3. The motivation for this is given at the end of Php. 4:5: The Lord is near!

Php. 3:20, "For our citizenship is in heaven, from which we also eagerly wait for the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ,

Php. 3:21, "who will transform our lowly body that it may be conformed to His glorious body, according to the working by which He is able even to subdue all things to Himself.

Php. 4:1, "Therefore, my beloved and longed-for brethren, my joy and crown, so stand fast in the Lord, beloved."

4. Now in Php. 4:6 we see the Faith-Rest Drill along with gratitude, which is part of grace orientation, expressed through prayer. The term we examined there is *epiekes*, which expresses a calm, gracious attitude toward others.

έπιεικής epieikēs

~NIDNTT "graciousness" gentle in the sense of not being ungracious, cruel, or abusive

5. The results of this relates to the peace of God, which is part of our concept of inner happiness.

Gal. 5:22, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, Gal. 5:23, "gracious kindness, self-control. Against such there is no law."

6. The situation they face is one that would threaten anyone's sense of security or peace or tranquility. This too was foreshadowed earlier in Php. 1.

Php. 1:28, "and not in any way terrified by your adversaries, which is to them a proof of perdition, but to you of salvation, and that from God.

Php. 1:29, "For to you it has been granted on behalf of Christ, not only to believe in Him, but <u>also to suffer</u> for His sake,

Php. 1:30, "having the same conflict which you saw in me and now hear is in me." [NKJV]

Php. 4:6, "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God." [NKJV]

Php. 4:6, "Y'all don't be anxious for any reason, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God." [RD]

The prohibition

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The positive command

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In every situation,

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In every situation,

by <u>prayer</u> and <u>supplication</u> along with <u>thankfulness</u> for the situation <u>let your requests</u> be made known to God Prayer προσευχή proseuch \vec{e} ; 1 petition addressed to deity, a general term for talking to God; prayer (1 Tim. 2:1)

Supplication δέησις $d\acute{e}\bar{e}sis$; urgent request to meet a need, exclusively addressed to God, petition, pleading. For self or others. (1 Tim. 2:1)

Thanksgiving εὐχαριστία eucharistía; 1 the quality of being grateful, with implication of appropriate attitude, thankfulness, gratitude 2 the expression or content of gratitude, the rendering of thanks, thanksgiving to God in prayer. (1 Tim. 2:1)

Requests αἴτημα aitēma requests, petitions (Php. 4:6)

- 1 Tim. 2:1, "Therefore I exhort first of all that petitions [pleading], prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks be made for all men, [RD]
- 1 Tim. 2:2, "for kings and all who are in authority, that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence." [NKJV]

Prayer προσευχή proseuché; ① petition addressed to deity, a general term for talking to God; prayer (1 Tim. 2:1)

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Requests ἔντευξις énteuxis; ① a formal request put to a high official or official body, petition, request, ② intercessory prayer (w. προσευχή, the general word for prayer, and εὐχαριστία, a prayer of thanksgiving (1 Tim. 2:1).

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μεριμνάω merimnaō
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γνωρίζω *gnōrizō* 3 sing pres mid imperative to make known

In every situation,

by prayer and supplication along with thankfulness for the situation let your requests be made known to God

Php. 4:7, "and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus." [NKJV]

ὑπερέχω huperéchō articular participle, relative participle "which surpasses, exceeds" to surpass in quality or value, be better than, surpass, excel, exceed

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
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φρουρέω *phroureō*3 sing fut act indic to keep, to guard; to set a garrison or fort to defend

Php. 4:7, "and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your <u>hearts</u> and <u>minds</u> through Christ Jesus." [NKJV]

καρδία kardia fem plur acc Literally, heart; Figuratively, the center or innermost part of men, animals, plants. The intellectual center of a person.

νόημα ηοεπα neut plur acc mind, thought **NIDNTT** "Heart and mind" (noēmata, literally, thoughts) can be used in parallel (2 Cor. 3:14 f.) or synonymously (Php. 4:7).



Prayer is the most powerful asset in the believer's spiritual life.
