

2. God cannot have a personal relationship with us after Adam's sin, because we are sinful and separated from Him.

a. We are all sinful.

<u>Ecclesiastes 7:20</u>, "For there is not a just [צַּרָּיק, *tzaddiq* "righteous"] man on earth who does good and does not sin."

<u>Psa. 14:2</u>, "The LORD looks down from heaven upon the children of men, to see if there are any who understand, who seek God. <u>Psa. 14:3</u>, "They have all turned aside, they have together become corrupt; There is none who does good, No, not one."

<u>Isaiah 64:6,</u>

"But we [the prophet Isaiah includes himself] are all like an unclean thing, And all <u>our</u> righteousnesses [אָדֶקָ*ה tzedaqah*] are like filthy rags; We all fade as a leaf, And <u>our</u> iniquities, like the wind, Have taken us away."

b. The consequence for our sin is death, which is separation from God. Not a physical death, but a spiritual separation from God, which then eventually resulted in physical death.

<u>Gen. 2:17,</u> "but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for <u>in the day</u> that you eat of it <u>you</u> <u>shall surely die</u>."

<u>Gen. 3:24,</u> "So He drove out the man; and He placed an army of cherubs at the east of the garden of Eden, and a flaming sword which turned every way, to guard the way to the tree of life."

Ezekiel 18:20, "The soul who sins shall die. The son shall not bear the guilt of the father, nor the father bear the guilt of the son."

4. Because God loves us, He Himself provided the way for our sins to be removed.

- b. God Himself provided the way for our sins to be totally removed, forgiven, and forgotten.
 - Isaiah 43:25, "I, even I, am He who blots out your transgressions for My own sake; And I will not remember your sins."

5. God's provision required a blood sacrifice.

Leviticus 17:11, " 'For the life of the flesh is in the blood, and I have given it to you upon the altar to make atonement [cleansing] for your souls; for it is the blood that makes atonement [a cleansing for sin] for the soul.' "

- sacrifice that would permanently pay for all sin.
 - their sins, once a year.' And he did as the LORD commanded Moses."

6. Animal sacrifices provided only a temporary atonement (cleansing) for our sin. Thus, animal sacrifices were substitutes for the one bringing the sacrifice. But these were temporary, requiring an annual repetition on the Day of Atonement. But these sacrifices were designed by God to picture the need for a substitute, a human

7. God provided a permanent removal of our sin through the promised Messiah who died as a substitute sacrifice for the sins of the world.

a. The Messiah died in our place (Isa. 53:4–6; 11–12).

Isa. 53:4, "Surely <u>He has borne our griefs</u> and <u>carried</u> our sorrows; Yet we esteemed Him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted.
