

The Global Flood


- 120 year grace period

A Picture of Salvation





- 2. The depth of the flood water and the duration of the flood.
 - The water covered the highest mountains by at least 15 cubits (about 22 feet) of water over the highest mountains.

<u>Gen. 7:19</u>, "And the waters prevailed exceedingly on the earth, and all the high hills under the whole heaven were covered.

<u>Gen. 7:20,</u> "The waters prevailed fifteen cubits (22 feet) at least, and the mountains were covered."

- 2. The depth of the flood water and the duration of the flood.
 - ii. In Genesis 7:19, the Bible uses the phrase "under the whole heaven." That phrase represents a huge area rather than a small place. So every area under the heaven was covered in water. It was a global flood.

<u>Gen. 7:19</u>, "And the waters prevailed exceedingly on the earth, and all the high hills <u>under the whole</u> <u>heaven</u> were covered.

<u>Gen. 7:20,</u> "The waters prevailed fifteen cubits (22 feet) at least, and the mountains were covered."

 If the Flood was local, why did Noah have to build an Ark? He could have walked to the other side of the mountains and missed it.

 If the Flood was local, why did God send the animals to the Ark so they would escape death? There would have been other animals to reproduce that kind if these particular ones had died.

 If the Flood was local, why was the Ark big enough to hold all the kinds of land vertebrate animals that have ever existed? If only Mesopotamian animals were aboard, the Ark could have been much smaller.

 If the Flood was local, why would birds have been sent on board? These could simply have winged across to a nearby mountain range.

 If the Flood was local, how could the waters rise to 15 cubits (8 meters) above the mountains (Genesis 7:20)? Water seeks its own level. It couldn't rise to cover the local mountains while leaving the rest of the world untouched.

 If the flood was local, it would not have solved the problem of the corruption of the human race worldwide.

• If the Flood was local, people who did not happen to be living in the vicinity would not be affected by it. They would have escaped God's judgment on sin. If this happened, what did Christ mean when He likened the coming judgment of all men to the judgment of 'all' men (Matthew 24:37-39) in the days of Noah? A partial judgment in Noah's day means a partial judgment to come.

 If the Flood was local, God would have repeatedly broken His promise to never flood the earth again.

3. The Ark's distinctive size, design, and purpose.

"According to this standard, the Ark was <u>437.5 feet long</u>, 72.92 feet wide, and 43.75 feet high. Since it had three decks (Gen. 6:16), it had a total deck area of approximately <u>95,700 square feet</u> (equivalent to slightly more than the area of twenty standard college basketball courts), and its total volume was 1,396,000 cubic feet. The gross tonnage of the Ark (which is a measurement of cubic space rather than weight, one ton in this case being equivalent to 100 cubic feet of usable storage space) was about 13,960 tons, which would place it well within the category of large metal ocean-going vessels today."

The notes in the Lesson 5, page 12 need to be corrected.

Studying the dimensions of the ark as recorded in Genesis 6:14–15, we can see that it was enormous, similar in size to modern, ocean-going freighters. Its volume was so great that it equalled the volume of 522 railroad stock cars. If the flood were just a local one, why the need for such a big, stable boat?

These were the figures used in Whitcomb and Morris, *The Genesis Flood*. The recent edition, 2022 of *The Genesis Flood Revisited* by Andrew Snelling is much more up to date following 6 decades of research.

Here he uses modern freight cars, much larger than those in use in 1960.

"Today, using a sheep as the average size of animals, then 240 animals of the size of sheep could be accommodated in a standard two-decked freight car. Thus, if there were as many as 16,000 animals to be carried on the Ark, then at the very most these animals would fit into 67 such freight cars, representing only a quarter of the carrying capacity of the Ark, equivalent to approximately 270 such freight cars. In other words, all the animals would fit into less than one of the three decks of the Ark. Furthermore, even if there had to be as many as 43,000 animals to be carried on the ark, then those animals could still fit into only 180 such railroad freight cars, which would represent twothirds of the 270 freight car carrying capacity of the Ark, meaning two of the three decks of the Ark would have carried the animals...."

"Woodmorappe has shown from a detailed analysis of the bodymass categories into which these 16,000 animals would fit that the vast majority were small, and even without allowing for large animals to be represented by juveniles, the median size of the animals on the Ark would have been the size of a small rat. Thus the above calculations based on the average animal size on the Ark being that of a sheep are overly generous, because Woodmorappe's calculations show that only about eleven percent of the animals on the Ark were substantially larger than sheep. It is therefore abundantly clear that with a few simple calculations this trivial objection can be disposed of once for all."

4. The commentary provided by the apostle Peter.


<u>2 Pet. 3:3</u>, "knowing this <u>first</u>: that <u>scoffers will come</u> in the last days, walking according to their own lusts,






Many in church started to treat "historical" science as "observational" science



<u>Gen. 1:6</u>, "Then God said, 'Let there be a firmament in the midst of the waters, and let it divide the waters from the waters.'

<u>Gen. 1:7,</u> "Thus God made the firmament, and divided the waters which were under the firmament from the waters which were above the firmament; and it was so.

<u>Gen. 1:8,</u> "And God called the firmament Heaven. So the evening and the morning were the second day."

<u>Psa. 104:8</u>, "They went up over the mountains; They went down into the valleys, To the place which You founded for them.





C. Warmer Oceans

Third, it is probable that after the Flood, the oceans would have been much warmer than they are now. Why? There are two reasons for this.

- As we go deeper into the earth's mantle, the temperature gets higher. Any underground water this deep would be heated up. The Bible tells us that this underground water, the "fountains of the deep," was what burst forth to flood the earth.
- Erupting volcanoes throw up very hot lava which heats up the ground and waters around it to extremely high temperatures.



To Create an Ice Age:

Importantly, this combination of


i. uplift,

- ii. cooler atmosphere, and
- iii. uniformly warm oceans

- There would have been large and frequent snowfalls in many areas.
- There would have been longer and colder winter periods and shorter and milder warm seasons.
- Many parts of the north and south would have experienced much larger polar ice caps and glaciers. In fact, the earth today shows evidence of glaciation over many areas.

<u>Job 38:29</u>, "From whose womb comes the ice? And the frost of heaven, who gives it birth?


Job 38:30, "The waters harden like stone, and the surface of the deep is frozen."



<u>Gen. 13:10</u>, "And Lot lifted his eyes and saw all the plain of Jordan, that it was well watered everywhere (before the LORD destroyed Sodom and Gomorrah) like the garden of the LORD, like the land of Egypt as you go toward Zoar.

<u>Gen. 13:11</u>, "Then Lot chose for himself all the plain of Jordan, and Lot journeyed east. And they separated from each other."

Unstable and Changing Climate

<u>Gen. 41:54</u>, "and the seven years of famine began to come, as Joseph had said. The famine was in all lands, but in all the land of Egypt there was bread.

<u>Gen. 41:55</u>, "So when all the land of Egypt was famished, the people cried to Pharaoh for bread. Then Pharaoh said to all the Egyptians, 'Go to Joseph; whatever he says to you, do.' " Is there really a coming global or final judgment?

<u>Rev. 20:11</u>, "Then I saw a great white throne and Him who sat on it, from whose face the earth and the heaven fled away. And there was found no place for them.

<u>Rev. 20:12</u>, "And I saw the dead, small and great, standing before God, and books were opened. And another book was opened, which is the Book of Life. And the dead were judged according to their works, by the things which were written in the books.
