
Misunderstanding of God's Law

Matt. 5:21, "You have heard that it was said to those of old, 'You shall not murder, and whoever murders will be in danger of the judgment.'

Matt. 5:22, "But I say to you that whoever is angry with his brother without a cause shall be in danger of the judgment. And whoever says to his brother, 'Raca!' shall be in danger of the council. But whoever says, 'You fool!' shall be in danger of hell fire."

B. People added to the Law: Jesus challenged what they added by living differently





Matt. 12:1, "At that time Jesus went through the grainfields on the Sabbath. And His disciples were hungry, and began to pluck heads of grain and to eat.

Matt. 12:2, "And when the Pharisees saw it, they said to Him, 'Look, Your disciples are doing what is not lawful to do on the Sabbath!"

Matt. 12:3, "But He said to them, 'Have you not read what David did when he was hungry, he and those who were with him:

Matt. 12:4, " 'how he entered the house of God and ate the showbread which was not lawful for him to eat, nor for those who were with him, but only for the priests?"

Matt. 12:5, "Or have you not read in the law that on the Sabbath the priests in the temple profane the Sabbath, and are blameless?

Matt. 12:6, "Yet I say to you that in this place there is One greater than the temple.

Matt. 12:7, "But if you had known what this means, 'I desire mercy and not sacrifice,' you would not have condemned the guiltless.

Matt. 12:8, "For the Son of Man is Lord even of the Sabbath."

C. People did not know there was more to understand about God's Word:

Jesus taught and interpreted Scripture further, especially explaining what the Bible teaches about Himself.

This is what Jesus did:

Luke 4:16, "So He came to Nazareth, where He had been brought up. And as His custom was, He went into the synagogue on the Sabbath day, and stood up to read.

Luke 4:17, "And He was handed the book of the prophet Isaiah. And when He had opened the book, He found the place where it was written:

Luke 4:18, "The Spirit of the LORD is upon Me, because He has anointed Me to preach the gospel to the poor; He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted."

This is what Jesus quoted:

Isa. 61:1, "The Spirit of the Lord GOD is upon Me, because the LORD has anointed Me to preach good tidings to the poor; He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are bound;

Isa. 61:2a, "To proclaim the acceptable year of the LORD,"

Isa. 61:2b

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II. Live a perfect life

A. Jesus lived a perfect life to fulfill God's Law.

Why did He have to live a perfect life? There are two reasons:

- A. He had to fulfill the Mosaic Law and also,
- B. give mankind a good example of how to live their lives.

Matt. 5:17, "Do not think that I came to destroy the Law or the Prophets. I did not come to destroy but to fulfill."

1 Pet. 2:22, "Who committed no sin, nor was deceit found in His mouth";

Rom. 5:18, "Therefore, as through one man's offense judgment came to all men, resulting in condemnation, even so through one Man's righteous act the free gift came to all men, resulting in justification of life.


Rom. 5:19, "For as by one man's disobedience many were made sinners, so also by one Man's obedience many will be made righteous."

B. Jesus lived a perfect life to leave believers an example of how to live.

Eph. 3:10, "to the intent that now the manifold wisdom of God might be made known by the church to the principalities and powers in the heavenly places,

Eph. 3:11, "according to the eternal purpose which He accomplished in Christ Jesus our Lord,"

1 Cor. 4:9, "For I think that God has displayed us, the apostles, last, as men condemned to death; for we have been made a spectacle to the world, both to angels and to men."

1 Cor. 11:10, "For this reason the woman ought to have a symbol of authority on her head, because of the angels."

Php. 2:6, "who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God,


Php. 2:7, "but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, and coming in the likeness of men."

NLT	ESV	NIV	NKJV
"gave up His divine privileges"	"emptied Himself"	"made Himself nothing"	"made Himself of no reputation"

Jesus gave up the use of His godly powers for solving the problems He faced in His humanity.





Matt. 24:36, "But of that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, but My Father only."

Matt. 8:25, "Then His disciples came to Him and awoke Him, saying, 'Lord, save us! We are perishing!'



Mark 1:35, "Now in the morning, having risen a long while before daylight, He went out and departed to a solitary place; and there He prayed."



Luke 9:18, "And it happened, as He was alone praying, that His disciples joined Him, and He asked them, saying, 'Who do the crowds say that I am?'"


ii. Jesus lived by God's Word.




Matt. 4:4, "But He answered and said, 'It is written, "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God." '"


Matt. 4:7, "Jesus said to him, 'It is written again, "You shall not tempt the LORD your God." '"

Matt. 4:10, "Then Jesus said to him, 'Away with you, Satan! For it is written, "You shall worship the LORD your God, and Him only you shall serve." '"





<u>Deut. 6:16</u>, "You shall not tempt the LORD your God as you tempted *Him* in Massah."



<u>Deut. 6:13</u>, "You shall fear the LORD your God and serve Him, and shall take oaths in His name."

III. Jesus relied on the power of the Holy Spirit.

Acts 1:4, "And being assembled together with them, He commanded them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the Promise of the Father, 'which,' He said, 'you have heard from Me;

Acts 1:5, "for John truly baptized with water, but you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

Acts 1:8, "'But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.'"

- 1 Cor. 6:19, "Or do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own?
- 1 Cor. 6:20, "For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's."

Matt. 3:16, "When He had been baptized, Jesus came up immediately from the water; and behold, the heavens were opened to Him, and He saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting upon Him."

Matt. 4:1, "Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil."

iv. Jesus practiced sanctification.

Luke 2:52, "And Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and men."


Php. 2:7, "but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, and coming in the likeness of men.








Jesus' "God
