1 Cor. 11:26, “For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord’s death till He comes.”






1 Cor. 1:23, “but we preach Christ crucified, to the Jews a stumbling block and to the Greeks foolishness,”


A. How God Sees Justice

Gen. 3:21, “Also for Adam and his wife the LORD God made tunics of skin, and clothed them.”



Abel kills animals as an offering to God.


Gen. 4:4, “Abel also brought of the firstborn of his flock and of their fat. And the LORD respected Abel and his offering,”



Noah sacrifices animals after the Flood.

Gen. 8:20, “Then Noah built an altar to the LORD, and took of every clean animal and of every clean bird, and offered burnt offerings on the altar.

Gen. 8:21, “And the LORD smelled a soothing aroma. Then the LORD said in His heart, ‘I will never again curse the ground for man’s sake, although the imagination of man’s heart is evil from his youth; nor will I again destroy every living thing as I have done.’”







Gen. 15:9, “So He said to him, ‘Bring Me a three-year-old heifer, a three-year-old female goat, a three-year-old ram, a turtledove, and a young pigeon.’”





1. Sin is ultimately against *Yahweh*.


Num. 5:5, “Then the LORD spoke to Moses, saying,

Num. 5:6, “ ‘Speak to the children of Israel: “When a man or woman commits any sin that men commit in unfaithfulness against the LORD, and that person is guilty,

Num. 5:7, “ ‘ “then he shall confess the sin which he has committed. He shall make restitution for his trespass in full, plus one-fifth of it, and give it to the one he has wronged.

Num. 5:8, “ ‘ “But if the man has no relative to whom restitution may be made for the wrong, the restitution for the wrong must go to the LORD for the priest, in addition to the ram of the atonement with which atonement is made for him.” ’ ”

Psa. 51:4, “Against You, You only, have I sinned, and done this evil in Your sight—that You may be found just when You speak, and blameless when You judge.”














Lev. 24:18, “Whoever kills an animal shall make it good, animal for animal.

Lev. 24:19, “If a man causes disfigurement of his neighbor, as he has done, so shall it be done to him—

Lev. 24:20, “fracture for fracture, eye for eye, tooth for tooth; as he has caused disfigurement of a man, so shall it be done to him.

Lev. 24:21, “And whoever kills an animal shall restore it; but whoever kills a man shall be put to death.”

What Justice Means to *Yahweh*






Yahweh's Warning

When God created man, He told them that the punishment for eating the fruit was death.


Gen. 2:16, “And the LORD God commanded the man, saying, ‘Of every tree of the garden you may freely eat;

What happened in the Garden of Eden




Adam and Eve killed their relationship with the God of the universe. This crime is so serious that the only fair, appropriate, and equal-value payment would be death.

CRIME #1: Eating the Fruit

PENALTY #2: Death


Can't pay.

What can be done ? They need another death ...


Isa. 59:2, “But your iniquities have separated you from your God; And your sins have hidden His face from you, so that He will not hear.”

God used a live innocent animal as a substitute to die in their place. God made restitution. He brought about justice through the shedding of the animal's blood for Adam and Eve.





Gen. 3:15, “And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your seed and her Seed; He shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise His heel.”


Genesis 3:15, [NLT]





Only when an innocent sacrifice dies in place of sinful man, then man can be made righteous. Only then can he enter a contract with *Yahweh*.



Jer. 31:31, “ ‘Behold, the days are coming, says the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah—

Jer. 31:32, “ ‘not according to the covenant that I made with their fathers in the day that I took them by the hand to lead them out of the land of Egypt, My covenant which they broke, though I was a husband to them, says the LORD.

Jer. 31:33, “ ‘But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the LORD: I will put My law in their minds, and write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be My people.’ ”

Ezek. 36:26, “I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit within you; I will take the heart of stone out of your flesh and give you a heart of flesh.

Ezek. 36:27, “I will put My Spirit within you and cause you to walk in My statutes, and you will keep My judgments and do them.”

Luke 22:14, “When the hour had come, He sat down, and the twelve apostles with Him.

Luke 22:15, “Then He said to them, ‘With fervent desire I have desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer;

Luke 22:16, “ ‘for I say to you, I will no longer eat of it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God.’

Luke 22:17, “Then He took the cup, and gave thanks, and said, ‘Take this and divide it among yourselves;’ ”

Luke 22:18, “ ‘for I say to you, I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes.’

Luke 22:19, “And He took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them, saying, ‘This is My body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of Me.’

Luke 22:20, “Likewise He also took the cup after supper, saying, ‘This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is shed for you.’ ”

With the Passover: *Yahweh* put in place a picture that would constantly remind mankind of the need for the blood atonement.
