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Psalm 118 Background

- 1. Written after the exile, possibly at the dedication of the second temple in 516 BC.
- 2. No stated author, circumstances, or historical context.
- 3. Written by the political leader who represents the people.
- 4. Communal thanksgiving and praise to God for delivering them from the nations that surrounded them.

The Call to Give Thankful Praise to God, Psalm 118:1-4

The processional comes to describe what God has done.

The people request:

The people express their praise

Cornerstone is literally the chief or head stone of the corner.

Who are the builders?

- 1. What is the stone? In context: it is Israel.
- 2. In the historical context: the Gentile nation/empire builders who reject the stone, i.e., Israel, which God uses now to build something new.
- 3. By typology it is applied to the Lord Jesus, who was rejected, despised of men (Isa. 53:3), but God will make Him the King of Kings and Lord of Lords (Matt. 21:42, 44).

Matt. 21:42, "Jesus said to them, 'Have you never read in the Scriptures: "The stone which the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone. This was the LORD'S doing, and it is marvelous in our eyes"?"

Matt. 21:43, "Therefore I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a nation bearing the fruits of it.

Matt. 21:44, "And whoever falls on this stone will be broken; but on whomever it falls, it will grind him to powder."
