

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Christ Died FOR Us Eph 4:32; Matt 18:21-25



Forgiving One Another

Eph. 4:31 Let all bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor, and evil speaking be put away from you, with all malice.

Eph. 4:32 And become kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God in Christ forgave you.

Eph. 5:1 Therefore become imitators of God as dear children.

The Words for "Forgive"

aÓfi÷hmi v. (aphieæmi), "let go, cancel, remit, leave, forgive" a‡fesiß n. (apheæsis), "release, pardon, cancellation, forgiveness"

Emphasizes the act of forgiveness

cari÷zomai v (*charizomai*), show favour or kindness, give as a favour, to be gracious to someone, to pardon;

Emphasizes the attitude underlying forgiveness.

FOUR Categories of Forgiveness

- 1. Forgiveness directed toward God, where the justice of God cancels the debt of sin. For all mankind without distinction. *Forensic Forgiveness*
- 2. Forgiveness positionally in Christ. Eph 1:7
- 3. Experiential forgiveness, 1 John 1:9
- 4. Relational forgiveness, Eph 4:32

Col 2:13 And you, when you were dead in your transgression and the <u>uncircumcision</u> of your flesh, He made you alive together with Him, <u>because He had already graciously cancelled/forgiven</u> all our transgressions,

Col 2:14 by eradicating the certificate of debt consisting of decrees against us, which was hostile to us; and He has taken it out of the way, having nailed it to the cross.

Col 2:15 When He had disarmed the rulers and authorities, He made a public display of them, having triumphed over them through Him.

Eph. 5:1 Therefore be imitators of God as dear children.

Eph. 5:2 And walk in love, as Christ also has loved us and given Himself for us, an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweet-smelling aroma.

1Cor. 4:16 Therefore I urge you, imitate me.

1Cor. 11:1 Imitate me, just as I also imitate Christ.

1Th. 1:6 ¶ And you became followers [imitators] of us and of the Lord, <u>having received the word</u> in much affliction, with joy of the Holy Spirit,

1Th. 2:14 For you, brethren, became imitators of the churches of God which are in Judea in Christ Jesus. For you also suffered the same things from your own countrymen, just as they did from the Judeans,

Heb. 6:12 that you do not become sluggish, but imitate those who through faith and patience inherit the promises.

Gal. 4:19 My little children, for whom I labor in birth again until Christ is formed in you,

Ro 8:29 For whom He foreknew, He also appointed to be conformed to the image of His Son, that He might be the firstborn among many brethren. (RD)

Rom 12:2 Do not be conformed (pressed into the mold) of the world, but be transformed... by the renovation, overhaul, of your thinking (how you think, what you think) that you might demonstrate with your life that God's will is good and acceptable and complete. [RD]

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Eph. 4:1 I, therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, beseech you to walk worthy of the calling with which you were called,

Eph. 4:17 ¶ This I say, therefore, and testify in the Lord, that you should no longer walk as the rest of the Gentiles walk, in the futility of their mind,
